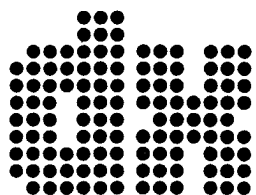
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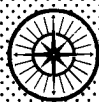
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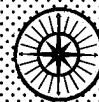

NEWS ABOUT BROADCASTING (+other) STATIONS

ALASKA: 5200 kHz, Aug 13 at 02.40 UT, rapid pulsing S2/S3, into KFS NW remote. Presumably HAARP test during publicized period and frequency range, per tip from Walt Salmaniw, Haida Gwaii-CAN. Indistinguishable from other

carriers on H2O fall, unlike CODAR circa 5400 kHz with diagonal traces. 5200 kHz cuts off abruptly at 02.44* UT, and not found further visually or audibly in this or many other possible bands up to 9.6 MHz. Shouldn't HAARP transmit some kind of clear ID ? I vaguely recall it does have an assigned callsign.

BOTSWANA: US Ambassador re status of USAGM **VOA Botswana** relay installation at near Selibe Phikwe.

The United States Ambassador to Botswana, Howard Van Vranken, has proved that while he is measured and diplomatic in his public remarks, he does not hesitate to defend Washington's policies and partnership with Botswana when called upon to do so.

During a recent media round-table in Gaborone, Van Vranken addressed a broad range of issues, including bilateral relations, United States assistance to Botswana, immigration policy and defence cooperation, offering detailed explanations on several matters that have attracted public interest.

Responding to a question about the purpose of the United States relay station near Selibe Phikwe, Van Vranken explained that the facility forms part of the US Embassy's operations in Botswana and falls under the US Agency for Global Media, formerly known as the Voice of America (VOA).

"My understanding is that while broadcasting activities have effectively been suspended, the operational capacity of the facility remains intact", he said.

According to the Ambassador, the facility continues to employ approximately 40 people, including technical staff and contracted security personnel. He said he had recently visited the facility and confirmed that it remains fully operational.

However, Van Vranken declined to comment on whether the station currently broadcasts or on the nature of any programming, saying, "I really cannot comment on whether they broadcast or what kind of messages they do or do not transmit".

CANADA: Canadian radio stations no longer need to renew their broadcast licenses.

The Canadian Radio-Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) has completed a reform of the licensing system: hundreds of AM and FM stations in the country will now be able to operate under perpetual licenses.

Previously, radio stations were required to apply for a renewal approximately one year before their license expired. Now, after the current license expires, it automatically becomes perpetual, and a separate renewal process is not required.

CHINA: 6185 kHz **CHBC**, 11.26-12.00* UT, Aug 4, fairly well heard at the beach; very unusual reception; non-stop Chinese music and songs, except they did play Miley Cyrus - "We Can't Stop," till time pips at 12.00UT and off the air; no QRM from the normally heard much stronger Mexico on frequency; there were no announcers / announcements at all; I strongly believe this must have been China, as I cannot imagine Mexico playing non-stop Chinese music, plus the distinctive time pips at ToH. So where was Mexico?

In the past they normally were heard stronger than CHBC and both usually went off at 1200* UT. Mexico with an earlier than usual closing time or just off the air today ? Has been quite a while since I last monitored the 12.00 UT closing. Needs more work to confirm what is happening!

Radio Habana Cuba - Resurrection !

Radio Habana Cuba has returned from the dead. Logged them last evening on 6000 kHz {most probably from RadioCuba site Quivican San Felipe TITAN previous 250 kW made once USSR units, WB.} at 02.30 UT with English sign in. You'll have to listen carefully as the signal was poor and modulation muddy, but you can distinctly hear the piano music used at sign-on and Ed Newman saying 'Radio Habana Cuba'. No other frequencies noted.

EGYPT: 9902.056+ kHz Aug 5 at 17.53-18.00+ UT, open carrier, but with some hum/roar/whine especially on the upper side, S=9+20/30dB into Uni Enschede Twente, The Netherlands. WRTH.org database file shows Turkish had been scheduled at 17-19 UT via Abis site. Not audible direct at 18.45 UT, but still into UTwente at 18.53 UT, 19.04 UT, but goes off 9902.060+ kHz at 1907* UT, and already on 9892.061UT, S=9+20/30dB, as soon as I can retune; there still past 19.32 UT, 9890 kHz being the scheduled Russian service from 19.00 UT. All following this tip:

"EGYPT - Back on air - but still zero modulation. It appears that the Abis transmitter had not shut down for good sometime in mid April. Starting August 1, I hear them again daily on 9872 kHz at 15:00 UT mixing with CRI China, producing a heterodyne. No programme heard - just "dead air". 9902 kHz heard around 17:45 UT only on August 1 and again on 9902 kHz at 17:30 UT tonight. 9892 kHz on August 1 from 19:00 UT. So far, no transmissions have been heard later in the evenings. I still wonder why they bother to come on air at all. All those kilowatts are just going to waste. Alan Holder, G4ZBH, Isle of Wight, U.K."

FRANCE: The boat race '**Mini Atlantique 2026**' has been running from July 22 to August 15. Formerly known as the "SAS" (Les Sables – Les Açores – Les Sables), the Mini Atlantique enters a new chapter with its 11th edition in 2026. The format remains as demanding as ever: two legs of 1,300 miles each, between Les Sables-d'Olonne and Horta in the Azores, with no assistance. 70 boats on the start line, including a highly competitive proto fleet — and Benoît Alt among the favourites.

Man announcer presents; A conversation w/a man correspondent, presumably; ID; Conversation in progress w/woman participation, too; 20.27 UT A tribal nigerian song by female singer; 20.29 UT Woman talking news. Fair reception w/interference by an intermittent and brutal "parasite", in addition w/Radio Marti in Spanish, too: 4~53533. Who is the "parasite" ?
13720 kHz Sun, Aug 16, at 20.30-20.42 UT USAGM '**Radio Marti**', from Greenville-NC state, USA, in Spanish to Cuba & LatAM. Note: At 20.30 UT, ending RFI Hausa edition and starts Radio Marti deportes w/baseball match live, "temporada nacional"! Narration and *comments* by two men announcers and a very noise assistance ! Good reception, without "parasite": 45544.

EiBi database list shows this is RFI in Hausa daily 06.00-06.30 UT. As usual, wish I knew some clues to identify Hausa, keywords. Not even sure how they say "This is" or "Radio".

GABON: Reconstruction of Africa Nr.1 in Gabon ?

Africa Nr. 1, located in Moyabi, Gabon, was once the most powerful shortwave broadcasting station in Africa. Initially,

France provided some of the funding, but later, Libya under the Gaddafi regime took over the funding and operation. However, with the fall of the Gaddafi regime in the Libyan coup in 2011, funding ceased, and the broadcasting station and transmission facility ceased operations in May 2013. Libya still formally holds private ownership.

The Gabonese government aimed to acquire management rights of Africa Nr.1 as part of its broadcasting modernization efforts and had been negotiating with Libya. On May 12, 2026, in the capital Libreville, an agreement was reached to transfer ownership of the station to Gabon. However, significant renovations to the Moyabi transmission facility and the Libreville studios will be necessary to adapt to the digital age, and attracting new technical and commercial partners will be a challenge.

JAPAN: Broadcasting since 1926 - NHK's 100th Anniversary.

"Nippon Hoso Kyokai (NHK) was founded in August 1926, as a broadcasting monopolist. New legislation changed the rules of the game in 1950, and added the option of commercial broadcasting to the radio landscape. NHK itself became more independent from Japanese governments, as a non-profit organization. It was now in a position to collect receivers' fees. The new "Broadcast Law" also required NHK to run a foreign-broadcasting service on shortwave - that would be Radio Japan.

Shortwave hadn't been popular with Japan's government from the start - a ban on shortwave receivers was in place at the time, and it seems to have come as an unpleasant surprise to the country's rulers when a newly-established medium-wave transmitter from Nanking were received on Kyushu, Japan's southernmost main island, in 1932.

Japan's first overseas radio service, also as part of NHK, was inaugurated on June 1, 1935 ? - but NHK had actually been on shortwave since June 1934.

The number of languages had risen to eleven by 1941, in line with Japan's invasion of other Asian countries.

Radio Japan is a world-class broadcaster, but - like in many places - struggling with budget constraints, and probably with a lot of pressure from nationalism and populism. NHK's 100th anniversary should be something to celebrate - both by Japanese and foreign listeners. Japan matters, and so should NHK and its foreign broadcasting service."

The support group broadcasts the Shiokaze program simultaneously on two frequencies to counter jamming by North Korea. The group pays NHK up to Yen 4 million in monthly fees related to the broadcasting, covering the costs with commissions paid by the Japanese government and donations.

As tensions in the Middle East have intensified, however, broadcasting for the region was expanded in March, leaving an inadequate number of transmitters at the Yamata station. The support group has therefore become unable to broadcast Shiokaze on two frequencies simultaneously.

Back then I had the URL's to access their content management server and yes the individual language programs were all the same collection of recorded files (which I had the ability to convert to MP3) but the spoken segments where recorded in each particular language.

Nothing back then (and it is almost certainly still the same today) was "live" - the programming was a assembled collection of audio files reordered previously - the news was accentually a reading of yesterday's articles from the Rodong Sinmun party daily newspaper.

I spent over 10 years frequently traveling in North Korea (I have reached all but one province), basically with a curiosity to understand the role of broadcasting and it's effect of the belief systems of North Koreans.

LUXEMBOURG: Junglinster Towers to be demolished

RTL's parent company CLT-UFA plans to demolish and dismantle the three antennas of the former Junglinster transmitter this autumn.

With its demolition, a landmark of Junglinster disappears after almost a century. The three 215-meter-high steel masts have stood on the Lensterbiert hill above the baroque church and the town hall since 1932. In its early days, the transmitter was the most powerful longwave transmitter in Europe. It operated continuously until 1974, after which it served as a backup until it was finally shut down in 2023.

RTL announced over a year ago that the three towers were no longer needed and that dismantling was planned. This will now be carried out by controlled demolition. A firm date has not yet been set, an RTL spokesperson told LW in response to an inquiry. "For legal reasons, dismantling before the beginning of October is not possible," he explained. Not all the necessary permits from the authorities have yet been obtained.

The municipality of Junglinster apparently had little room for maneuver. "The antennas are not listed as historical monuments. Therefore, the mayor approved the corresponding request from the operator, CLT-UFA," confirms Tom Weber, alderman of the municipality of Junglinster. The permit is now valid for two years. According to Mayor Ben Ries, only the upper part of the masts will be demolished by explosives; the lower part, which is accessible by machinery, will be dismantled using conventional methods. The municipality has also issued a demolition permit for the RTL transmission tower in Beidweiler.

In April 2025, a teenager climbed one of the three pylons without safety equipment, triggering a large-scale rescue operation by the police and CGDIS (Grand-Ducal Fire and Rescue Corps). This incident may have led RTL to view the three towers solely as a safety hazard.

RTL plans to build a large residential area for more than 1,000 new residents on the "Um Bichel" site around the current transmission masts.

It seems uncertain because SNRT, its new owner, is refusing to comment, but the transmitter's power has been reduced on 171 kHz. The history of this established radio station is quite curious. It was on 28 Mar 1978, during a visit to France by Hassan II, that the decision was made to create a Franco-Moroccan commercial radio station, and the project management was entrusted to the French company SOFIRAD.

The Franco-Moroccan agreement establishing this radio station, as well as its specifications, remained confidential, and its legal status remained unclear because the documents were never published in the Official Bulletin.

Radio Mediterranee Internationale Medi1 was launched in 1980 and was 25.5% owned by the Moroccan Bank for Foreign Trade, 25.5% by the Omnium Nord Africain group, and 49% by France. The French stake was held through the Compagnie Internationale de Radio et Television (CIRT), whose parent company was SOFIRAD, which belonged

to the French state.

From the outset, France (which held only a minority stake) guaranteed that this radio station would never become part of the French public broadcasting holding company, Audiovisuel extérieur de la France. A state subsidy (in the range of 1 to 2 million euros) was paid to Medi 1 for about 20 years.

However, this subsidy was insufficient to achieve operational balance. Subsequently, the strong growth of the Moroccan advertising market and the de facto exclusivity enjoyed by Medi 1 improved its results: profits reached 1.4 million francs in 1994.

The station took advantage of this to invest in and modernize its facilities in order to increase its audience in Algeria and Tunisia via longwave broadcasting. Medi 1 was independent of France, but for 30 years, the CEO was Pierre Casalta: a former journalist with Radio Monte Carlo and close to Sofirad. From 1991, CIRT, representing Sofirad, was responsible for recruiting French journalists and making them available to Medi1. A subsidy of 7 million francs from the French government covered personnel costs.

Following France's withdrawal, Medi1 became a private, commercial company. French and Moroccan partners, including banks and large corporations, were represented on the board of directors. In recent years, the Moroccan government's desire to create a public broadcasting sector, including the acquisition of 86.3% of Medi1 radio by the National Broadcasting and Television Company (SNRT), has brought this operation to fruition.

It is impossible to have a clear vision of the future of longwave radio in Morocco, especially since SNRT has ceased broadcasting from its Azila transmitter.

Medi 1 covers Morocco on FM. Longwave radio covers the greater Maghreb region (Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Mauritania, and part of Libya), as well as the Mediterranean coast (Spain, France, and Italy). Maintaining the Nador transmitter represents a significant financial burden.

The antennas underwent major upgrades in 2009 at a cost of €30 million, 50% of which was funded by the Moroccan government. However, the transmitters have not been replaced and are now nearing the end of their lifespan.

Airing every Sunday at 00.30-01.30 UTC on 17665 kHz - the broadcast will combine local and international news bulletins and analysis, practical information and segments dedicated to human rights and disinformation.

It will focus on Myanmar news, and include features on China and Taiwan, a weekly special programme, media programme, public service programme, and a counter disinformation programme.

To maximise its impact, the audio content will also be broadcast across Mizzima's accounts on digital platforms, which count over 21 million followers on Facebook and 3 million subscribers on YouTube.

Since the military coup of February 2021, Myanmar has plunged into a severe crackdown against journalism. More than 200 reporters have been detained, at least 39 of whom remain behind bars today, while the licences of at least 15 media outlets have been arbitrarily revoked.

Myanmar ranks 166th out of 180 countries and territories in the 2026 RSF World Press Freedom Index. The country is the world's third-largest jailer of journalists, just behind China and Russia.

"This radio broadcast, which is freely accessible to anyone equipped with a shortwave receiver and can't be blocked or jammed on a wide scale, will allow the Myanmar public to once again access independent news despite the junta's censorship, internet blackouts and digital surveillance, and the growing influence of propaganda narratives from other countries in the region — particularly from China," said Cedric Alviani, Director, RSF Asia-Pacific Bureau.

"For decades, shortwave radio has been a vital lifeline for the people of Myanmar, providing access to trusted information even in the country's most remote and conflict-affected areas. Through this partnership with Reporters Without Borders (RSF), we are strengthening that lifeline and helping ensure that people across Myanmar continue to receive reliable, independent news.

We are sincerely grateful to RSF for its invaluable support and unwavering solidarity with the people of Myanmar in defending the fundamental right to access independent media. Launching this initiative as Mizzima marks its 28th anniversary makes this moment particularly significant, reaffirming our long-standing commitment to independent journalism and to serving the people of Myanmar," said Soe Myint Managing Director and Editor-In-Chief, Mizzima. VIETNAM: Since checking in May and June 2026, it appears that the Voice of Vietnam domestic service on shortwave has additional transmitters back on air. Vietnam has not registered any frequencies with the HFCC since the A25 season, which at that time included those used for the domestic service. Here are my latest observations made in late July 2026:

7435 kHz Noted with VOV-1 in Vietnamese. HFCC A-25 indicated on air between 2145-1700, but may sign-off before 1700. Sontay? This frequency had not been heard during May/June 2026.

9635 kHz Believed to be on-air between 2200-1530 UTC with programmes mostly in ethnic languages (presumably one of the VOV-4 regional services). HFCC A-25 listed a transmitter at Sontay.

11720 kHz During May/June 2026 this frequency had been heard coming on air around 1050 and going off between 1330 to 1400 UTC. However, it is now on for a longer duration, possibly 2145-1700 UTC? HFCC A-25 indicated the transmitter at Sontay at 2145-1030 and 1330-1700 and Xuan Mai at 1030-1330, so perhaps both transmitters are back on air now, although the on/off times may vary slightly for each site.

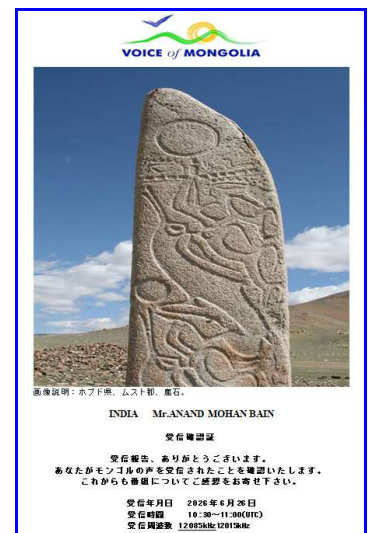
