Hello again,

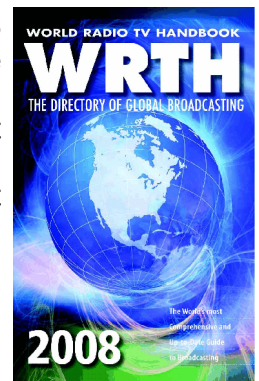

International Radio in Europe

Thomas Völkner raises the question: are producers and consumers largely ignored?

Over the past 15 years international radio stations have been operating in a constant state of transition. Whether it's the traditional analogue short wave bands, Digital Radio Mondial, satellite radio, internet live-streams and on-demand audio, terrestrial rebroadcasting, etc. – it seems uncertain which means of distribution is most effective for broadcasters like the BBC World Service, the Voice of Russia, or Deutsche Welle Radio. There is no single answer that fits everybody's requirements equally. At the same time, as media consumption has changed fundamentally and information from across the border is relatively easy to obtain, fewer countries are willing to finance their international radio stations. The latter appear like a relic from a somehow distant past, and – let's face it – some broadcasters' sound and formats match the image of 'Old Time Radio'.

The development can probably best be seen with broadcasts in the German language: before the 1990 reunification and into the 1990s, Germany was among the top target areas. Broadcasters in more than 40 countries offered newscasts and entertainment shows in German, including stations in most neighbouring countries. It was simply a must to air programmes for those who lived on the frontline of the Cold War.

The turning point was the BBC World Service's 1999 strategic decision to terminate "BBC auf Deutsch". A radio service that was launched in 1938 as a weapon against Nazi Germany, that gained the highest reputation in both East and West Germany amongst decision makers as well as ordinary listeners – this radio became history. Several services followed London's example, amongst them in two countries where German is an official language: Austria and Switzerland.

So, why are others still on the air? What are their objectives in a changing Europe? Will there perhaps be a single pan-European audio stream in German some time soon, bringing together the content from various broadcasting centres? Or will more stations cease to exist – more or less quietly?

A recently published book "International Radio in Europa – Situation und Zukunftsperspektiven" draws a picture of the current state of international broadcasting in German. The volume that I have been working on contains articles from 10 radio Journalists and representatives from radio stations across Europe, all giving descriptions of their work, discussing possible future scenarios, and looking back at radio services that are already history. For the first time in recent years, colleagues and listeners can read opinions and recommendations from within the industry.

Let's take a look at Germany's own broadcaster, Deutsche Welle, that offers content via radio, television, and the internet. As DW's Uta Thofern explains, there are still some advantages of radio over the other two media: if broadcast traditionally it can be listened to on the move: it is easier and cheaper to produce and to distribute than TV and internet content; and it is the least costly medium for the individual listener. Given the fact that the leading European broadcasters have many years of experience in the joint production and distribution with the "Radio E" project and its various formats, Uta Thofern suggests daily pan-European radio programmes, fed from multiple production houses and broadcast across the old continent – maybe using new transmission standards like DRM.

Working together with colleagues in other countries also tops Radio Prague's list, as the station's director Miroslav Krupicka explains: "It is important to mention international cooperation which plays an increasingly important role in international broadcasting. Besides working together with foreign-language services of neighbouring countries in exchanging stories, Radio Prague is involved in several on-going international projects", says Krupicka and mentions his station's working relationship with WRN as well as the involvement in the BBC's and RFI's "Sachsenmagazin" project in Saxony. Radio Sweden's Gundula Adolfsson points out another cross-border cooperation: Stockholm's German language service has been joining forces with regional public broadcaster NDR in Kiel to produce "Ostseemagazin" ("Baltic Sea Magazine"), a weekly show that is broadcast by Radio Sweden and by NDR on FM across Northern Germany.

Cooperation and local re-broadcasting appear to be a very promising way to disseminate content: there are stations that pass on their headline news to noncommercial stations such as Radio F.R.E.I. in Erfurt, others relayed by webcasters like Radio 700, and most recently some international players started to cooperate with the Berlin-based DVB-T and satellite newscaster RadioRopa. One has to

realise that with the demise of shjortwave there is no longer a predominant way of distribution for international radio stations, but instead a growing number of smaller, more regional, and more cutting-edge outlets.

While editors and journalists try hard to position their services on the changing market, it is also important to consider the decision makers' rationale: "There is a reason why the paradigm shift – technically, geopolitically, economically – went along with a change of significance of international radio", says Wolf Harranth, Vienna-based media journalist and former presenter with Radio Austria International, "and that is the ignorance of the decision makers, of those in power. Those who are directly affected, i.e. the producers and consumers, are to a large extent ignored".

ANTARCTICA - LRA36, Radio Nacional Arcángel San Gabriel, 15476, was coming in well Oct 11. It would have been much more listenable here if it were not for my local crackling line noise problem which was close to the S-9 peaks of RNASG, but I kept with it from tune-in at 1943 until off at 2102. It was mostly music, with pauses for announcements, all in Spanish, many of them pre-produced promos, altho it was hard to follow much of what was being said. First, I compared the signal to Buenos Aires but 15345 was dominated by Morocco in Arabic, and a very weak carrier could just be detected on the low side of it. Had there been no QRM, I would not be surprised if LRA36 was stronger than LRA## (didn't the 15345 transmitter once have its own specific call?)

1943, singing was in progress; 1945 YL announcement; 1947 songs; 2000 disco-beat music ran past hourtop; 2001 YL talked over music briefly (which annoys me), no ID heard, then brought the same music up again, until it ended shortly later. ``De Esperanza al Mundo`` mentioned this and a few more times, presumably the program title. 2002 promos; 2005 giving numbers (phone?), 2005:30 mentioned LRA36 with address, said that ``hasta las 18, seguiremos informando`` but program continued to be mostly music, not informative --- in fact, there was precious

little in the way of Antarctic culture ;-). More music and announcements; 2028 YL said it was música folclórica, again talking over the music. If you really appreciate the music you will not talk over it nor applaud a live performance until the music stops completely! 2029 mentioned ``De Esperanza al Mundo`` again, more music. 2059 announcement by OM, did not sound like a formal sign-off, but stopped at 2101 and carrier off at 2102* (Glenn Hauser, OK, DXLD)

ITALY - A mostly unceremonious end to 77 years of international radio from Italy (updated). The international radio broadcasts of RAI Italy have ended. But the pre-programmed RAI multilingual stream is still playing the usual opening announcements, e.g. Hungarian at 1935. But instead of the news, we hear bland instrumental music as filler.

David de Jong provides a good summary of the closure of RAI shortwave broadcasts at Radio Netherlands Media Network, 1 October 2007. David says that the news in English, French, and German on RAI's "Notturmo Italiano" has also ended. However, the RAI International Onde Medie page still lists those three language for "Notturmo Italiano." I think David is correct, but perhaps someone in Europe could listen at 2303, 0003, 0103, 0203, or 0303 UT on 567, 657, or 900 kHz, to see if non-Italian news survives. (German did definitely NOT. we)RAI's elimination of international shortwave broadcasts did get a brief mention by Italian newspaper columnist Ieri Ernesto Galli della Loggia, as mentioned by Andrea Lawendel in Radiopassionae, 30 September 2007. PAKISTAN - Crashed all stations almost regularly in range 9349-9384 kHz with broom in times 1555-1617 UTC, from 9380 kHz. (Rumen Pankov-BUL, Sept 27)
English Program of Radio Pakistan News Channel 5080 kHz 1600-1700 UT. 5080 kHz, 1600-1700 UT, Radio Pakistan News and Current Affairs Channel broadcasts English program under the title "English Hour" at 5080 kHz from 1600 to 1700 UT. The program commences with the National News Bulletin followed by news commentary, sports and business news and a discussion program in English titled "Insight". For this broadcast the Islamabad 100 kW transmitter API-4 is used, which is reportedly of Russian origin and was installed in 1979. It developed some faults in 2001 which have now been rectified to some extent. The transmission of the English programme of News and Current Affairs Channel of Radio Pakistan is primarily beamed for the domestic listeners but it has been reported heard in Scandinavia and Far East on shortwave. The transmission frequently disappears from the designated frequencies, is inconsistent and the transmitter is unreliable, mostly produces buzz and noise. At times the audio resembles robotic voice. But the transmitter is not as bad as the one being used for External Services (API-3 100 kW). This transmission could be of interest to DXers trying to monitor radio transmission in English from Pakistan. Intersted DXers might not be able to hear the signal of External Service (API-3 100 kW) but the News Channel (API-4 100 kW) could be heard in many areas outside Pakistan. It has been getting SINPO ratings of up to 45333 from many regions. The problems of course are frequent disappearance, muffled audio and the transmitter buzz. Some listeners might find difficulty in understanding the English being spoken in South Asian accent. This English program is in addition to the one broadcast at 0830-0930 at 15100 and 17835 for World Service for Europe for which 250 kW transmitter is used.

PRIDNESTROVYE - HIER SPRICHT RADIO PMR /// NACHRICHTEN AUS TRANSNISTRIEN

Hardly anyone from the West knows about Transnistria (also called Pridnestrovia [sic] or PMR). It is not internationally recognized, has no noticeable voice, and the little media coverage there is draws only a one-dimensional picture. The EU would like to have the problem off the stove.

The authors Kramar and Marcell Nimführ have been exploring the country to the left of the river Dnjestr for the past six years. They were able to get to know the country and its people on their travels and have recorded many reports and portraits. Moreover, they were lucky to meet Andrey Smolensky, an interpreter, radio presenter and university lecturer. He brought them to places no western eye had ever seen before and acquainted them with people who otherwise would not have been that friendly to any other journalist.

Transnistria belongs to the Republic of Moldova (the Moldovians say), Transnistria is autonomous (the Transnistrians say), Transnistria should not exist (says the western world). Although Kramar und Marcell Nimführ are westerners they really do have an intimate knowledge of the PMR. The authors do not defend any regime and do not support possible criminal actions of any regime. There is no one truth – and this book does not claim any such truth. Rather, it shows how the Pridnestrovians (Transnistrians) see their country.

"This is Radio PMR" is a photography book, a travelogue, a book on propaganda and counter-propaganda and above all it is a magnificent photographic portrait put forward by the Viennese Journalists. A differentiated picture of the "small Soviet Union" is drawn in numerous interviews and transliterated radio reports.
