



WRTH Publications are pleased to announce that a file containing the Summer (A08) schedules for International and Clandestine/Target Broadcasters is now available for download from the WRTH website <<http://www.wrth.com>>. The pdf file runs to 104 pages and is 377kB. Included in the file are not only the broadcast schedules for 236 stations but also frequency listings and our broadcasts in "English, French, German, Portuguese and Spanish" section, both of which are derived from the schedules. We hope you find this file a useful accompaniment to the printed WRTH 2008. **(Sean Gilbert, WRTH Editorial Team)**

The International Telecommunication Union and the State Government of Geneva have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on the hosting of **ITU TELECOM WORLD 2009** in Geneva, Switzerland on April 18. This follows the April 2006 decision by ITU to award this prestigious event to Geneva. ITU TELECOM WORLD will be held at the Palexpo exhibition centre, Geneva from 5 to 9 October 2009. The booth sales for WORLD 2009 have already begun, and this global showcase of state-of-the-art information and communication technologies (ICT) is expected to attract close to a thousand exhibitors from around the world.

The ITU TELECOM WORLD MoU was signed by the Secretary-General of ITU, Dr Hamadoun Touré, the President of the Geneva State government, Mr Laurent Moutinot, and the Geneva State Chancellor, Mr Robert Hensler. The signing ceremony took place in the historic Alabama room of the Geneva State Hall, where the International Committee of the Red Cross was born 145 years ago.

"ITU TELECOM WORLD 2009 will be the biggest, most spectacular ICT exhibition and Forum ever," said Dr Hamadoun Touré. "Riding on the wave of innovation unleashed by the ICT industry to meet the ever-growing demand for new products, services and applications, WORLD 2009 will capitalize on new growth centres in the world of ICT. Developing countries, which have been recording the highest growth rates in the world, will fuel growth in the ICT industry by providing new business opportunities."

Dr Touré added that Geneva offers excellent prospects for all comers: manufacturers, service providers, policy makers and, not least, the discerning public. "I am confident that Geneva will provide the best facilities for the record numbers of exhibitors and visitors who are expected to attend this landmark ICT event. ITU TELECOM WORLD 2009 will establish a unique networking platform for the top names in the ICT industry to interact with global leaders and, at the same time, showcase their products to the world at large," Dr Touré said.

ITU's regional event **ITU TELECOM AFRICA 2008** just took place successfully in Cairo from May 12 to 15. The next regional events will be **ITU TELECOM ASIA 2008** from 2 to 5 September in Bangkok, Thailand, and **ITU TELECOM AMERICAS 2010** from 1 to 4 March 2010 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

About Logs and "Logtigers"

Perhaps you listen to your favourite radio station and want to promote those programme, as I am for example for R Taiwan. And then: there is no signal on the listed frequency, for days You ask: WHY? Some guy not only asked himself but also the radio station and the community in a blog. Some answer: Silly nonlog. Really silly?

Not only the content of a broadcast is worth to be considered of, not only in the days of the Cold War there was (and I think already is) to be noted what is NOT content of the broadcast, or even the broadcast is already transmitted. Perhaps they closed their studios rapidly? Only that one language or some more? What about the satellite relais? Internet? Or are there some bills not being payed or not being payed in time? Any other incidents (earthquake!) perhaps leading to technical problems with links, seawatercables etc.? Political reasons? Some problems with the staff (strike? arrest?).

Those questions should also be asked by other OMs, and the management of the broadcaster will note: Oh, there are really some really interested listeners to our programmes - and perhaps don't think of cuttings in programmes and languages.

It is the background of broadcasts which we must consider much more, not only the "logtigers" but also the programme and favourite station listeners as well. We are the ones especially dealing with information by shortwave radio – and then must do it consequently!

BOLIVIA - R. Santa Cruz, 6134.8, must be the best bet for Bolivia in North America, at least in our evenings. Once Repùblica and jamming are done at 0000, the frequency happens to be open, with nothing even on 6135.0 to het it. After noticing a pious het from another Bolivian on 5952.4 which had no chance against WYFR on 5950, I tuned to 6134.8 at 0008 May 11 and there was Andean music, with brief announcements at 0011 and 0020, "buena mÙsica"; seemed to be interviewing kids at 0025, but mostly music, still at 0035, and at 0055 when applause was heard, so may have been a live event ...

Never heard an ID, but no doubt this is it, due to frequency offset and other reports, which have had it closing at 0108. Maybe those were not UT Sunday, because this time it kept on going at 0113 and 0123 checks, but nothing heard at 0130, altho the carrier was still detectable, and that went off at 0134*. Surprisingly, RHC 6140 was not much of a problem until after 0100 when a weak station on 6130 also came on, squeezing RSC. (Glenn Hauser, DXLD)

EQUATORIAL GUINEA - R. Africa is back, on 15190.0, after a three-week absence, last heard April 17. Only fair with deep fades, but most of the signals on 19m were degraded. Joined at 2000 by Harold Camping WYFR via Ascension 15195. Radio Taiwan International will stop using WYFR as of July 1st.

This of course explains why they want to find out if there is still interest for shortwave transmissions of RTI English to North America. Obviously a decision is still pending whether they will have done with it on June 30 or make new arrangements, and completely new ones would be necessary to continue. A possibility I could imagine would be to use Montsinéry within the airtime exchange with RFI, of course at the expense of European services via Issoudun.

What also remains to be seen is whether Family Radio will quit using the transmitters in Taiwan or continue, perhaps scaled down, by way of commercially leasing airtime. Of particular interest will be the fate of the mediumwave transmissions for China (Kai Ludwig, Germany, May 3)

"From May 4th till September 6th, RTI's English broadcast to South Asia will be changed from 11600 KHz to 15515 KHz [via Issoudun in France]." This refers to the broadcast at 1600- 1700 UTC. The parallel frequency is 11550 kHz. (May 5th, 2008 - 12:01 UTC by Andy, Media Network blog)

RADIO FREE ASIA RELEASES SECOND RADIO PIONEER QSL CARD APRIL 2008

Radio Free Asia is proud to announce the release of its 21st QSL card honoring German physicist and radio pioneer, Heinrich Rudolph Hertz (1857 - 1894). Hertz was the first to broadcast and receive radio waves. He demonstrated the existence of electromagnetic waves by building equipment that not only produced radio waves, but also detected them. His experiments with electromagnetic waves led to the development of the wireless telegraph and the radio, his name stands for radio and electrical frequencies; hertz (Hz). The QSL card below will be issued for all valid RFA reception reports from April 1 – June 30, 2008. This is the second in our series of QSL cards honoring radio pioneers. The first one honored Marconi. Future cards will include other radio pioneers like Nikola Tesla, Reginald Fessenden.



Radio Free Asia

Created and funded by the U.S. Congress, Radio Free Asia (RFA) began in March 1996. As a surrogate broadcast network, RFA provides accurate and timely information, news and commentary about events in Asia. It is a forum for a variety of opinions and voices from within Asian nations whose people do not fully enjoy freedom of expression.
