Hello again,

Welcome to another issue of our DX MAGAZINE. Please remember that the next issue of our DX MAGAZINE will be our usual summer double edition No. 8/9, which will be mailed in mid-August. And now let's start with our usual news from outside the club - this month only one item in German for our German members:

Diesen Monat zwei Informationen der **Bundesnetzagentur** für die Handy-Benutzer unter unseren Mitgliedern: Rechtzeitig vor Beginn der Urlaubszeit wurden die Tarife für das EU-Ausland weiter abgesenkt. Wer mit seinem Handy im EU-Ausland telefoniert, zahlt im "Eurotarif" ab dem 1. Juli 2009 für abgehende Anrufe höchstens 43 Cent pro Minute (zzgl. Mehrwertsteuer); bei eingehenden Anrufen dürfen nicht mehr als 19 Cent pro Minute (zzgl. Mehrwertsteuer) abgerechnet werden. Dies bedeutet eine Absenkung der seit Ende August 2008 geltenden Obergrenzen um jeweils 3 Cent pro Minute. Erstmalig werden auch die Preise für den SMS-Versand im EU-Ausland begrenzt. Sie dürfen nun einen Betrag von 11 Cent (zzgl. Mehrwertsteuer) nicht überschreiten. Beim Empfang von SMS gibt es keine Änderungen; dieser bleibt, wie auch im Inland. kostenfrei.

Ab dem 1. Juli 2009 sind Notrufe von Mobiltelefonen in Deutschland nur noch mit einer aktivierten Mobilfunkkarte, der sog. SIM-Karte, möglich. Bisher war die Notrufnummer 112 auch ohne SIM-Karte von jedem Mobiltelefon aus erreichbar. Die betriebsbereite Mobilfunkkarte ermöglicht eine eindeutige Identifikation des Karteninhabers, so dass zukünftig Missbräuche besser verfolgt werden können. Auch im Fall einer Sperrung der Mobilfunkkarte für abgehende, kostenpflichtige Verbindungen oder bei einem fehlenden Guthaben auf einer Prepaid-Mobilfunkkarte kann ein Notruf getätigt werden. Voraussetzung hierfür ist lediglich eine betriebsbereite SIM-Karte. Ist der Aufbau einer Notrufverbindung über den eigenen Mobilfunknetzbetreiber nicht möglich, erfolgt die Herstellung der Verbindung über ein anderes Mobilfunknetz.

This frequency must be a total loss for KNLS in its E Asian target area, but the 1200 English is also on 7355, not checked today, tho often sufficient here at least during the first part. (gh)

Frenetic group singing in Afro-style is good identification. 2040 22/6 (Charles Jones, Castle Hill NSW (FRG8800 with 80m longwire, July Australian DX News via DXLD)

CHILE - Frequency change of Voz Crist/La Voz via SGO=Santiago from June 3: Spanish to Northern SAm 2300-0200 NF 11665 SGO 100 kW / non-dir, ex 17680 1200-2300 on 17680 SGO 100 kW / non-dir, ex 12-02 (DX Mix News, Bulgaria, 09 June via DXLD)

CHINA - 6043, Voice of Shangri-La. Site unknown. First heard on 3/6 with pleasant sounding Asian song at 1023 with muffled announcements. Subsequent loggings on 8/6 and 12/6 heard songs and Chinese announcements but no ID, then, on 18/6, unknown Asian language until 1100, then an EE ID "This is the Voice of Shangri-La", then into Chinese! ID heard at this time again on 23/6 (Dennis Allen, Milperra NSW (Icom R75, Realistic DX160, Dipole), July Australian DX News WORLD OF RADIO 1467, via DXLD) Nei Menggu PBS? (Craig Seager, ADXN ed.)

Surely PBS Yunnan, spur of 6035 as frequently reported in DXLD, but the Shangri-La bit is new. Can Ron Howard hear that English segment? (gh, WORLD OF RADIO 1467, DXLD)

Firedrake check June 25: at 1222, nothing audible on 8400 or 9000 but at 1331, both very poorly audible. At 1242, very poor on 13500 only but gone at 1338 recheck.

However, the CNR1 jammers were doing much better. At 1238 kid singing off-key (on key in Chinese terms?) on 11840, poor but in the clear, unlike on // 11825, 11805 and 11785 where it just happened to collide with Western broadcasts in Chinese! Also on 12040, 13830. 11825 mix had a "Voice of America" singing ID in English at 1232.

So could 11840 be a legitimate CNR1 frequency? Of course not! Per Aoki, It's there to jam All India Radio's Chinese service, altho inaudible here.

Firedrake at 1242 on June 26, all //: 8400 (good), 9000 (good), 14420 (poor) and 15600 (fair). (Ron Howard, Asilomar Beach, CA, Etón E1, dxldyg via DXLD)

Firedrake check June 26: before 1300 barely audible on 9000; at 1305, very poor on 14420, nothing on 13500, 13970 or any others of the usuals.

Firedrake check June 27: at 1319 just barely audible on 8400, 9000; at 1320 JBA on 14420; at 1321 poor on 13970, but significantly better than the others.

Firedrake check June 29: at 1310, fair on 13970, nothing on 13500 or 14420; at 1214 JBA on 8400, trace? on 9000.

Firedrake check June 30: at 1313 fair on 13970, unheard on any higher frequency; at 1331 very poor on 8400, not 9000 (gh, DXLD)

Chinese Firedrake jammer at 1630 UT June 30 on 13500.00, S=7-8 (Wolfgang Büschel, Germany, June 30, dxldyg via DXLD)

ChiCom jamming check July 1: at 1300, Firedrake very poor on 13970 just as it was pausing into open carrier for a pentaminute. At 1311, FD fair on 15150, poor on 14420, while CNR1 collision with BBC Chinese via Singapore was plenty strong on 15285. Just tuned in 17705 with CNR1 // 15285 as it was going off at 1315* --- that matches exactly the All India Radio Chinese service at 1145-1315 on 17705. At 1317 FD on 17500, poor. That's a Sound of Hope frequency, per Aoki. Then I heard one Chinese station on 17515 at 1317, // 15285, so CNR1. This is jamming BBC Uzbek via Cyprus at 1300-1330 only. At 1427 on 15285 I was well hearing only one station in Chinese with song, presumably CNR1. At 1428 found VG signal from Firedrake on 15780, during drums-only passage. Aoki, EiBi and WRTH A09 update have nothing on 15780, so we can only guess it's another Sound of Hope tempojump (gh, DXLD)

CHINA [EAST TURKISTAN] - CRI in English, 9470 at 0105z June 30 with 500 kW at 308 to Europe, in the middle of the night no less. A special night owl broadcast for insomniacs? All daylight path over the pole via Kashi (although Aoki lists Urümqi). Kashi's azimuth to central Texas is 354 so much less than 500 kW aimed my way, over 7500 miles. Urümqi only 300 miles closer

(Jerry Lenamon, Waco TX, Etón E-1, sloper, dxldyg via DXLD)

Rather aimed at KAZ + RUS, is like 0500 a.m. local summer time in Moscow? (wb)

Sky-wave jammer near Kashi in Xinjiang province, western China (39N20/75E46): one of 13 rotatable Thalès ALLISS antennas with 500 kW Thales TSW2500 transmitters.

COLOMBIA - 5910, Marfil Estéreo. 7/04/09 0835-0845. OM in Spanish playing back-to-back music then a long block of ads and station promos. Lots of 'Marfil Estéreo' ID's. Fair signal.

6010, La Voz de tu Conciencia, Puerto Lleras, 7/04/09 0746-0810. Female preacher in English being translated into Spanish by an OM. There was no ambient sound to indicate if this was recorded in studio or live before a congregation as in previous loggings. No ID at ToH. Transmission had a flutter and a hum. Poor (Bruce Barker, Broomall, PA, NRD535D and an Alpha Delta DX Sloper, DXLD)

CONGO DR - 6209.9, Mon + Fri 18-2007 UT. Ich hatte die Radio Kahuzi Frequenz letztes Jahr monatelang abgehoert und immer nur Montag und Freitag von ca. 18 UT bis zum Sendeschluss zwischen 2007- 2008 UT Signale aus dem Kongo hoeren. Diese Sendetage bestaetigte mir der Sender dann Monate spaeter auch. Erkennungszeichen von Radio Kahuzi ist die Frequenz: 6209.9, nie 6210 kHz. Dort sitzen die erwaehnten Mischprodukte [Griechenland --- gh], die

teilweise auch so schwach sind das man sie gern mit dem Kongo-Signal verwechseln kann. (Christoph Ratzer, Austria OE2CRM, June 28, in a-dx)

6209.9. Radio Kahuzi Congo extension, all weekdays 0530-2007 UT confirmed --- Martin Elbe DD9MW reports in A-DX: Radio Kahuzi Congo DPR now all weekdays on air to 2007 UT, (ex Mon + Fri) (wb)

Seine Antwort ist, daß das jetzt für jeden Wochentag gilt:

Richard McDonald: "We appreciate your confirmation, as we have just now sent you the list of changes to our schedule : beginning all week days at 5:30 UTC in French, and 16:30 to 20:00, in Swahili, English and French."

Danach dann noch zwei Hymnen, das macht dann etwa 2007 UT als Sendeschlußzeit. Die Frühsendung geht bis 0700 UT, auch wenn 0530 schon etwas zu spät für uns ist, könnte das bei kürzer werdenden Tagen eine interessante Möglichkeit sein.

Die aufgeführten Englisch- und Französischsendungen sind meistens Liveübernahmen des VoA-Satellitenfeeds, die Swahilisendungen werden aufgezeichnet und um einen Tag versetzt abgestrahlt. Zur Mittagszeit übernimmt Radio Kahuzi nochmal eine Stunde VoA, aber das ist hier ja eh nicht hörbar.

CUBA - RHC observed on 11770 at 2058-2030 [sic] in Spanish and from 2030 in Arabic. A change from listed 11750 (Edwin Southwell, England, July BDXC-UK Communication via DXLD)

Not exactly. 11770 was ex-11820 which collided with Saudi Arabia, as discussed extensively in DXLD a couple months ago; 11810 was ex-11750 (gh/DXLD)

5965 & 6000, R Habana, 1630, July 1, The past few days I've noticed R Habana active in the middle of the day in Spanish on the 49 meter band. I don't speak Spanish, but I guess this has to do with the recent coup in Honduras. 49 meters would be the ideal wavelength for daytime transmissions to Central America from Cuba (David Hodgson, TN, WOR 1468, DXLD)

RHC anomaly monitoring July 2: at 0622, found 11760, 6140, 6060, 6000 all // in Spanish instead of English, leaving only 6010 for English. But that's really all we need with its VG signal aimed usward. At 0626 noticed an additional RHC Spanish outlet, 6120 undermodulated and an echo apart from 6140. The question is, why are so many Spanish frequencies needed; just national pride?

0700+ is too late for me, but the night before, July 1, Ron Howard in California was still hearing RHC, as late as 0826, now all in Spanish on 6000, 6010, 6060 and 6140. So are they really running 24 hours in Spanish during the Honduran crisis? Spanish normally ends at 0500, and English at 0700.

My next check at 1307 July 2: unscheduled 5965 again on the air this morning with good signal, but nothing on 6000; however that must have been a tempo dumpoff, as 6000 was back at 1312. Also // 11800 an echo apart. Still gone from 12000 at 1323 leaving VOR Chinese in the clear. At 1325 I was monitoring 11800, very distorted as they were starting an "8-minute" health segment about Venezuela, but it was already over at 1332 with ID and news headlines. At 1402 still on and audible on 5965 as Antonio Gómez again made his imaginary frequency announcement identical to yesterday's --- "15120, 15360, 13760, 13680, 13780, 11760, 12000, 6000".

Quick check at 1542 found the same three frequencies on the air as yesterday, filling the 15-20 UT gap, 11760, 11800 and best 13760 as heard Pres. Zelaya mentioned immediately. There may well be others as plenty of spare transmitters are available at this time, but I was busy listening to Happy Station (gh, DXLD)

6010, Radio Habana Cuba; 0521, 2 July; English, Weekly Update & Death Silence (on prisoners in the U.S.). SIO=534- "QRM" is CRI in English. CRI via Cuba at this time not on latest sked I have, but the CRI was // 6020, S40 & // 6190, SIO=544 both via Sackville (per CRI sked). Unrelayed incoming CRI feed or someone at RHC listening to CRI with an open mike? Too bad for La Voz de tu Conciencia (Harold Frodge, Midland MI, USA, Drake R8B + 125 ft. bow-tie; 85 ft. RW & Cumbre DX via DXLD)

RHC's schedule is also upshaken in prime-time. UT July 3 at 0335 check, found Spanish on 11760, 11690, 6140, 6060, 6000 and 5965, NO English! Their website schedule shows English is supposed to be on 6140 and 6000 at 0100-0700, with 6060 and 6010 joining at 0500-0700.

At 0553 July 3 I rechecked the 49m frequencies, and now 6140, 6000, 5965 and undermodulated 6120 are in Spanish, while 6060 and 6010 are in English (presumably, different programming with reggae at the moment). No sign of a mix

with CRI audio on 6010 as Harold Frodge heard 24h earlier.

You never know what RHC is going to do next. It's only safe to say that no two consecutive days are identical as far as frequency usage. July 3 at 1310 I find that they are back on 12000! This had been missing the past few days, while new 11800 had appeared, so I had concluded that was a move to avoid VOR in Chinese. I gave them too much credit. Now the collision resumes on 12000, and 11800 is still on the air too, strong and distorted // 11760 which is loud and clear.

At 1336 I find recent new morning channel 5965 is still going too with deportes report // 6000. At 1338, also running on the three 22m frequencies plus two leapfrogs, 13580, 13680, 13760, 13780, 13880. 1340, also audible on 15120, 15360 (gh, DXLD)

RHC from 0823 to 0912, July 3. English on 6140; Spanish on 6000, 6060 and undermodulated 6120. Noted strong open carrier on 6010; turned on and off and with test tone, for about 3 minutes; off at 0905; probably RHC testing transmitter (Ron Howard, Asilomar Beach, CA, dxldyg via DXLD)

RHC still operating contrary to previous scheduling and currently published scheduling, UT July 4, presumably all prompted by obsession with the Honduran situation:

At 0610, Spanish on 6140, 6120 and 6000; English on 11760, 6060 and 6010.

At 1401, all Spanish of course, on 5965, 6000, 11760, distorted 11800, and still announcing 12000 instead of 11800, but 12000 back off the air this time.

1505 check reconfirms the additional mid-day transmissions are still running, audible on 13760, 11800, 11760, 11690, 6000 and very weak 5965; this last one had some co-channel QRM. Per Aoki, most likely CRI 5965 in Russian, 55 degrees from Beijing also usward, rather than BBC Urdu via Oman. RHC not found now on any other 13, 15, 17, or 9 MHz channel. For daytime mid-range coverage they really ought to be using at least one 9 MHz channel; but who am I to advise RHC?

Checked again at 1600, RHC IS audible on 5965 despite all-sunny path; at 1611, 6000 and 5965 still audible, with a bit of marimba music, then mentioning R. Nacional de Venezuela [see also] and the Honduran coup. At 1616, 11690, 11760 and 11800 still on too (gh, WOR 1468, DXLD)

CYPRUS TURKISH - (Northern). 6150.03, R Bayrak, June 30, 0211-0229. Nonstop US oldies by Cher, Del Shannon, Roy Orbison, Gene Vincent, slightly off frequency which is clear after Budapest off 0200. No ID but choice of music and awful audio leave no doubt it's them. (Martien Groot, Schoorl, Netherlands, WOR 1467, DXLD)

11590, Radio Cairo (Abu Zaabal), 0414-0421, 7/4/2009, Arabic. Traditional music at 0414. Time pips at 0415 followed by talk by man. Kor'an recitation at 0420. Very good signal with initially low audio, which improved during spoken

segments (Jim Evans, Germantown TN, E1, Eavesdropper Dipole, DX LISTENING DIGEST) 11590 scheduled 2300-0430, 330 degrees usward, the first sesquihour in English (gh, DXLD)

EQUATORIAL GUINEA - 15190, R. Africa, 2124, 7/4/09. Brokered religious program with country western style music. Good on peaks (Jerry Strawman, Des Moines, IA Drake R8, Wellbrook ALA-100 115' Loop, dxldyg via DXLD)

ERITREA - 7175, Voice of the Broad Masses of Eritrea, Asmara, 1427-1450, 05 Jul, Afar (listed), local songs, talks; 25432. 73, (Carlos Gonçalves, Portugal, dxldyg via DXLD)

ETHIOPIA - 9704.2 R. Ethiopia, Geja Dera, 1511-1603, 21 Jun, Vernacular, announcements, local songs, talks, news (pres) at 1600; 35433. (Carlos Goncalves-POR, wwdxc BC-DX TopNews June 24)

7110.06, Radio Ethiopia, 2040-2101*, July 4, Horn of Africa music. Talk in listed Amharic. Sign off with National Anthem. // 9704.18 - both frequencies poor, weak in noisy conditions. (Brian Alexander, PA, DXLD)

Then into 10 minutes on News by an OM, followed by more Afro Pops until 0716 when the signal faded to unreadable. Signal was poor thruout (Bruce Barker, Broomall, PA, NRD535D and an Alpha Delta DX Sloper antenna, dxldyg via DXLD)

Altho one expects them to pronounce 'Afrique' as in French, the word is officially "Africa", pronounced as in English. One must listen very closely to tell the différence, and who knows, maybe they do slip into French at times.

I often hear a weak station in French on 9580, which has to be the last SW frequency left from this country, Africa Number One; such as June 26 at 0537, French talk, but no comparison to the signals from DW/Rwanda on 9480, 250 kW at 295 degrees; or to CVC Zambia on 9430, 100 kW at 315 degrees. ANO is supposedly 250 kW at 350 degrees, 0500-2300 --- but undermodulated. I really miss the big clear daytime signals they used to put thru on 15475, even 17630 from the ailing transmitter, which they are supposedly going to revive, unlike Pres. Bongo (gh, DXLD)

GEORGIA [ABKHAZIA] - 9535, Apsua Radio, Sukhumi. In Vernacular at 0245 (new time; under REE in Spanish) // 9495, MW 1350 on 13/6. Close/down at 0300 and on the air goes on 9495, 1350 (Rumen Pankov, Sofia, Bulgaria (Sony ICF 2001, Marconi), July Australian DX News via DXLD) or put another way:

Apsua Radio (Abkhaz Radio) observed on 13 June:

During recent years substantial investments had been made into the 1539 kHz transmission facility, including a new NVIS antenna for skywave service in the morning and evening: http://www.waniewski.de/id330.htm

The old tube transmitters have been replaced as well, if I recall correct by a set-up of 2 x Thomson S7HP. The new scheme may reflect a minimum usage that must be kept after these big investments. Personally I wonder if ERF meanwhile regrets its deep involvement into this mediumwave operation. (Kai Ludwig-D, dxld July 2)

English started at 1326, with frequency given (so probably an ID). Between the summer QRN and the hams, was poor reception. They must have had timing problems today, as I noticed the gong/bell started late (1203) on 6130 and the switch in languages here was early by about 4 minutes. BTW: 1249 was my local sunrise, Vientiane sunset at 1148.

6130, LNR. 1416-1423, June 29 (Mon.). After the news in Laotian; introduction in Laotian for "Functioning in Business"; mentions "VOA" who produces this program in English; "Hello. I am Elizabeth Moore. Welcome to Functioning in Business"; show about making and confirming reservations (sounded like a repeat program); poor. Scheduled for Mon. and Tues., but often also noted on Fri. and Sat., for the 1415 to 1430 time period.

7145, Lao National Radio, 1308-1348, June 29. Best reception so far; in French with musical fanfare between items; 1331 into English (. GMT, on a frequency of 97.25 MHz. , thanks to Mauno Ritola for confirmation that this FM frequency is Laos; M & W alternating with assume news items. Summer noise and ham QRM after 1329 made for poor reception, but the French segment was almost fair (Ron Howard, Asilomar Beach, CA, Etón E1, dxldyg via WOR 1467, DXLD)

MADAGASCAR - 6134.89v, RTVM (presumed), 1342-1406 + 1449-1452*, June 28. For the first time I noticed segments of both French and assume Malagasy; ads; Hi-Li music; conversation in Malagasy (clearly not French) between two men which seemed to be a comedy; went off-the-air in midsentence; almost fair. Unable to confirm any parallels. (Ron Howard, Asilomar Beach, CA, Etón E1, dxldyg via DXLD)

7395, Radio Sweden; 2153-2159:34*, 1 July; English feature on hockey; ID & Description of the structure of t

MALI - 5995, RTV du Mali, 06/28/09 0635-0701. Tuned in to tribal music being played by a YL DJ. Songs had plenty of vivid drums and flutes and were very lively and bouncy -- great for dancing or just toe-tapping. Tunes continued until 0645 when an OM announced in French and vernacular that a brief Radio Play was beginning. The short skit, which was entirely in vernacular, ended at 0655 when tribal music resumed. A full ID in French was broadcast at 0700 by a YL, "Ici Radiodiffusion Télévision Mali" then into an OM talking in French (Bruce Barker, Broomall, PA, NRD535D and an Alpha Delta DX sloper antenna, dxldyg via DXLD)

9635, RTV du Mali, 7/06/09 *0800-0815, Transmission opened with IS of drums and flutes followed by a station ID by a YL in French. Next, an OM talked in vernaculars. There was none of the usual bright tribal music, just non-stop talk with multiple Radio Mali ID's until fade-out at 0815. Signal was poor (Bruce Barker, Broomall, PA, NRD 535D and an Alpha Delta DX Sloper, dxldyg via DXLD)

7285.9, R. Mali, Kati, 1430-1630, 05 Jul, Vernacular, tribal songs; French later for football; 45444; // 9635 good but with weaker modulation. (Carlos Gonçalves, Portugal, dxldyg via DXLD)

MAURITANIA [and non] - They are finally on, at least on 60 m, and probably even on Tues. evening, but I admit I didn't check that yesterday: 4845 R. Mauritanie, Nouakchott, 1837-, 24 Jun, Vernacular, talks; 44333, CODAR QRM. Now, whether they were active on 7245 today, I simply don't know; it is typical of them to be active on just one HF outlet whenever something is wrong, and when they do, then it's 4845 that is audible, not 7245. It is, nevertheless, presumed that Nouakchott uses the very same transmitter for both frequencies. (Carlos Gonçalves, Portugal, 1846 UT June 24, dxldyg via DXLD)

MONGOLIA [and non] - 12085: Two stations in English. 1530-1534 heard Voice of Mongolia and Iran (close/down at 1534) on 13/6. Checked on next days same situation, maybe there is some automatically in the transmitter operation in Iran (Rumen Pankov, (Sony ICF 2001, Marconi) (July Australian DX News via DXLD)

Iran does have English at 1530, but supposed to be on 7305 and 9600, from two different sites, so no mixing product possible there.

Here's the real explanation: a sloppy overrun of IRIB's Bengali broadcast via Kamalabad, indeed scheduled 1430-1530 on 12085 (gh, DXLD)

MOROCCO - 9575, Médi 1 / R Mediterranée Internationale, 6/25/09 0620-0650. Tuned in to ads in French and Arabic

followed by YL in Arabic playing North African-Middle Eastern music until 0630, when an OM in French gave a Médi 1 ID. This was followed by news with correspondent reports and actualities. At 0640 another ad cluster was played along with Medi 1 ID's. An OM talking in French followed until 0650 when more ads and Médi 1 promos were heard. Signal was fair to poor (Bruce Barker, Broomall, PA, NRD535D and an Alpha Delta DX Sloper antenna, dxldyg via DXLD)

MYANMAR - 9730.79, Myanma Radio, 1242-1303 + 1334-1530*, July 4. In vernacular; playing wide range of music (indigenous music/singing, pop western style tunes sung in vernacular, pop/rap songs, etc.); CRI QRM (English) on 9730.0 till off at 1357; best in USB; from 1357 to 1500 reception was fair; the usual indigenous instrumental music before sign-off. New sign-off time? (ex: 1512*); clearly parallel with 5915 (poor under CRI).

Believe the addition of this frequency in parallel is a very recent development. If today is any indication, this clearly is no longer their Educational Service. The format is completely different than in the past, when they had lessons about chemical and math formulas, English language lessons, etc. Have they started a new service? If so, I will miss hearing their English lessons. This was not // to 5985 nor 5770.

5770, Myanmar Defense Forces BS via Taunggyi, 1225-1240, July 4. In vernacular; EZL pop songs in vernacular; 1232 the usual military marching band music at their local ToH (also noted again at 1331). A good day for Myanmar reception.

5985.0, Myanma Radio, 1305-1330, July 4. Even though I have not recently reported on Myanmar, they have been routinely heard, just not as strong as their winter time reception. In vernacular; EZL pop songs in vernacular; usual indigenous music and chimes at BoH (their local ToH) (Ron Howard, Asilomar Beach, CA, Etón E1, dxldyg via WOR 1468, DXLD)

I confirmed Myanma Radio on 9730.83 kHz at 1530* on July 5, too. Hiroshi confirmed parallel with 5915 kHz. Severe QRMed CRI on same frequency (S. Hasegawa, Japan, NDXC)

Not to be confused with the spurs from RTI 9735 Japanese service I hear occasionally; never any audio, but the buzz against 9730 and 9740 matches (gh, DXLD)

5915.00, Myanma Radio, 2345-0014, July 05/06, vernacular talk, westernized pop songs about equal strength to co/channel CRI in English but surfaced when CRI signed off 2356. Reception on 5985 was too messy for me to be able to make out if 5915 was // or not.

NETHERLANDS [non] - Surprised to hear unscheduled Spanish on 15580, June 30 at 1308, interview about Honduras and Zelaya's plan to reclaim his office, soon IDed as "La Matinal de Radio Nederland para las Américas", into another interview with a Buenos Aires professor. But cut off abruptly at 1314:30*, back on at *1318-1325* when cut off abruptly again as the topic had shifted to US pullout from Iraq; still off when I quit monitoring at 1335.

What's going on here? Like RHC, has RNW added more transmissions because of the Honduran crisis? RN does not normally have Spanish at this hour on any frequency, ending at 1227 on 9715, 9895 both Bonaire. The only appearance of 15580 on RNW's current schedule is for the WYFR English test at 0001-0158, but previously used during that bihour for RNW's own Spanish. Perhaps this was just a test or a total mistake; controlled by a timer with am and pm upmixed? However, VOA uses 15580 later from São Tomé and Botswana, so this could also have emanated thence, or even Greenville as quite a strong, steady signal. The audio was somewhat lower-fi, I thought, than we are accustomed to from Bonaire (gh, DXLD)

This was an unscheduled one-off transmitter test from Bonaire. Due to an earlier technical problem, our engineers wanted to reproduce the exact same conditions to identify the cause (Andy Sennitt, Hilversum, ODXA yg via DXLD)

PAKISTAN - I have now received a printed copy of R. Pakistan's external and domestic services. There is no longer any listing for Peshawar or Quetta and so I assume the SW transmitters there are now definitely closed.

However, Islamabad (Rewat) API-8 100 kW is listed as carrying Regional Programme Rawalpindi-III (listed Pindi-III programme) via 4790 at 0045-0215 and 1445-1815, and on 7265 at 0900-1215. The same programme also via Rawalpindi (10kW) on 4790 at 0230-0425 and 1335-1430.

I think these timings will actually be 1 hour earlier due to DST. There are no longer programmes in Balti or Sheena listed, and of course their schedules never list the Kashmir clandestine transmissions (Noel Green, England, Jun 15, DSWCI DX Window June 24 via DXLD) I have not heard Islamabad (Rewat) on 4790 since June 2008! SWEDEN - SWEDISH RADIO TO DROP BELARUSIAN SERVICE

Swedish Radio has decided to discontinue the service in Belarusian, from September 1, 2009. The broadcasts on medium and shortwave began on a test basis in 2004. Elle-Kari Höjeberg, responsible for Swedish Radio's broadcasts in foreign languages, says that since then "there has been an explosion in other platforms that medium and shortwave". She adds that Swedish Radio will look for new ways to reach an audience in other parts of the world. Ingemar Löfgren, head of SR International, which also includes Radio Sweden, says his ambition is to strengthen and prioritize other areas within the department. He points out that SR International will continue to broadcast in Russian, a language that is also understood in Belarus.

TAIWAN - Taiwan radio fun facts! --- In some ways the advantages of living in a place that is not recognized by the UN and has only a small handful of diplomatic relations, 23 to be exact can be a good thing. Here in Taipei and the rest of Taiwan, there is less than 10 minutes an hour about MJ. The same as with radio.

Some interesting facts about Taiwan, ROC (Republic Of China) radio & television. Taiwan's population is 23 million people. But yet we have:

- 1. Seven 24 hour news channels.
- 2. 200 radio stations.

- 3. Taipei has 86 satellite trucks for live feeds.
- 4. 89 pirate stations; a few are low power, but the majority are HP.
- 5. 187 local channels on cable.
- 6. Both the AM and FM bands are packed.
- 7. 2 free off air sex channels (co owned by Japanese companies)
- 8. A number of shops where you can by both AM and FM transmitters.
- 9. 1 local English station, 1 local Japanese station, 1 local Korean station
- 10. 2 fishing radio stations

It's very annoying to listen to radio here.

At Central Broadcasting where I work on one of the domestic channels in Chinese, two floors up is very interesting. They flood [that floor?] has Falun Dafa Radio, Chinese International Radio (broadcast only to China on AM), Freedom Radio (broadcast only to China on AM) and one which seems to change names every few months. Within the building we call this floor in Chinese "ghost floor", because these are not official Taiwan stations. Or you could say we see them, hear them, but high level officials won't admit to them.

A few years ago there was one interesting station that has since left the airwaves after only 3 years on air. It was called China National Radio; yesm just like China's China National Radio. The station was set up in 1990s to broadcast to China on AM. The staff was made up of Chinese born in China, but who had since got US passports. The idea of the station was to broadcast to China from Taiwan, but make people in China [think] they were listening to CNR. Chinese with US passports were hired, because they had mainland accents. You could say a Chinese version of Radio Martí. It was short-lived because the jamming from China was so strong that there was no way to pick it up outside Taiwan, so it was axed. Best signal by far on 19m, tho VOA Greenville B also in well on 15390 Creole, 15590 & 13715 Spanish. Means sporadic E had already kicked in, but this morning did not reach VHF channel 2. 13845 WWCR not yet on the air, but it too inboomed after 1200.

WWCR, 13845, strong Es-assisted open carrier, June 26 at 1306; really open, no hum, crosstalk or squeal either. PMS audio finally came up circa 1320.

15825, WWCR was also inbooming with Tony Alámo, whose ministry has continued unabated during the M-F 13-14 hour despite his legal problems and presumed incarceration pending trial which keeps getting put off, latest date being July 13. Es opening not strong enough to bring in WWRB 18770 harmonic or anything on channel 2, yet.

WWRB, 18770, fading in and out at 1954 June 26, weak signal with Brother Scare, 2 x 9385 tnx to sporadic E.

I urge others to hunt for harmonix of US SW stations during this Es season. WWRB seems to be the prime radiator, and 18+ MHz a prime range. I'm not going to figure out all the possible second harmonix of 9 MHz stations in the daytime, but frequent thorough bandscans 18-25 MHz at least could be productive.

WYFR with its dozen Okeechobee transmitters would seem a good target in much of the USA beyond the short-skip zone from the Floridic appendage, but I can't recall ever hearing a WYFR harmonic, where suppression must be well-managed.

Most stations' lower fundamentals are not on the air in the daytime, but Es also happens in the evening, even late at night when you would expect 18+ MHz to be dead.

Here are the most likely frequency ranges; keep your calculator handy:

Note the overlaps, so once you hear something, you may need to try more than one divisor, and then match up the audio on the fundamental.

WEWN, despite its other problems, is seldom audible on harmonix, but check for these, only a partial list emphasizing daytime:

Sackville is another possibility, as are nearby Latin American outlets, even the low-power ones, which may have poor harmonic suppression.

And there he is, Brother Scare, barely audible with fades at 1315. MUF

built up to channel 2 by 1430, channel 4 with an NAB Nightlight at 1447 (gh, DXLD)

WWRB, 18770, just barely audible at 1429 July 1, with whistling music accompanied by piano, which the Brother Scare service had been playing most of the past hour as tuned past 9265 WINB before 1400, and 9385, the latter being the fundamental of 18770. Once again 18770 reception correlates with sporadic E opening inbringing strong WWCR 15825, 13845, and up to channel 5 TV in the next few minutes (gh, DXLD)

U S A [and non] - WEWN, 11530 in English sermon, VG June 25 at 1219 plus the usual distorted parasitix around 11520 and 11540. Something was getting creamed on 11520, per Aoki YFR in Indonesian via Taiwan, Catholix vs Protestants trying to convert Moslems! And on the other hand, something on 11535 was getting it from both sides. I should have focused on IDing that as nothing is listed, altho VOK is on there at other times (gh, DXLD)

Its signal was better than in 2006 considering actual propagation, better than the best moments of SIBC. At peak 45434. (Robert Wilkner-FL-USA, DXplorer July 9)

Two new 10 kW SW transmitters are being installed now; big inauguration should be mid-July but testing begins this week [and there have already been lots of reports of 3945 -gh]. Frequencies are 3945, 5050 and 7260. Plans to use 3945 at night and 5050 in the daytime; 7260 for daytime in the summer, likely not until November. [RNZI have been registering 5050 for some seasons now on behalf of Vanuatu, but it has never been used or reported yet gh] RV also have a new transmitter building which is well air-conditioned. The new transmitters should last a long time if they are properly cared for, avoiding corrosion, etc. Studio equipment has also been upgraded with a fair amount of Oz and NZ aid; their own technicians have been trained to look after it. Two Americans are there installing the American-made transmitters, and Steve White of RNZI accompanied Adrian also to SOLOMON ISLANDS [q.v.], and has stayed there a while longer as Adrian returned to NZ. Steve will commission the new equipment when it is finished. DRM reception of RNZI is good, and used for relaying news broadcasts. SW is for the outer islands but should be heard further afield too. (notes by Glenn Hauser-OK-USA, dxld July 10)

- TIBET/CHINA/MADAGASCAR noted today,at 1330-1400 UTC,mostly between Firedrake music renditions, and, also, beneath same music. Dhabbaiya site,per Aoki. Also on 17560 kHz, via Talata, with weak signal, but no Firedrake. At 1400 UTC there was no break, only music bridge, Id. and news. Altough I'm not an expert, spoken language was not Mandarin. and, I think, that CNR px's always Id. on TOH. Even so I think I'll consider this log as presumed. 2009/06/15
- 17585 USA/THAILAND VoA, Greenville, noted in English, at 1400-1430 UTC with usual px. and fair reception. Interesting was that, at 1422 a huge silent carrier apeared on QRG, drowning Greenville signal. From 1428 onwards VoA, from Udom Thani, per Aoki, totally obliterated Greenville signal. 2009/06/15

- 4885 BRAZIL Radio Clube do Para June 16 0855-0910 First time heard in several days, although that may be local listenening conditions as much as anything. Tuned in for om with lots of chatter in PP. Quick canned ID at 0902 then back to rapid talk. No music. Sounded like a sermon but I heard no religious references. Usually a good music player. Fair signal.
- 5910 COLOMBIA Marfil Estereo. 7/04/09 0835-0845. Om in Spanish playing back-to-back music then a long block of ads and station promos. Lots of 'Marfil Estereo' ID's. Fair signal.
- 5995 MALI RTV du Mali (Bamako) 7/10/09 0645-0700 At tune-in there was bright, vibrant tribal music. Vocals with lots of drums, flutes and whistles. These very lively selections were interrupted briefly by an Om in vernacular at 0655 followed by more indigenous music. Radio Mali ID was heard at 0700 by an Om in French.
- 6010 COLOMBIA La Voz de tu Conciencia, Puerto Lleras 7/04/09 0746-0810. Female preacher in EE being translated into SS by an Om. There was no ambient sound to indicate if this was recorded in studio or live before a congregation as in previous loggings. No ID at ToH. Transmission had a flutter and a hum. Poor.
- 9575 MOROCCO Radio Mediterranee Inter. better known as Medi-1. 7/10/09 0725-0748 Om talking in Arabic at tune-in. But the station ID at 0730 was in French. This was followed by an Om with News in FF, including many correspondent reports and several actualities. At 0742 a YI took over also in FF. At 0745 there was a block of ads and Medi-1ID's and station promos. Signal was poor
- 9575 MOROCCO Medi 1 / R Mediterranee Internationale 6/25/09 0620-0650. Tuned in to ads in French and Arabic followed by YI in AA playing North African-Middle Eastern music until 0630, when an Om in FF gave a Medi 1 ID. This was followed by News with correspondent reports and actualities. At 0640 another ad cluster was played along with Medi 1 ID's. An Om talking in FF followed until 0650 when more ads and Medi 1 promos were heard. Signal was fair to poor.
- 9580 GABON Africa #1 06/25/09 0655-0716. I tuned in to hear back-to-back Afro Pops in French. At 0700 there was an Om with an "Afrique Numero Un" Id in FF. Then into 10 minutes on News by an Om, followed by more Afro Pops until 0716 when the signal faded to unreadable. Signal was poor thruout.
- 9635 MALI RTV du Mali 7/06/09 *0800-0815 Transmission opened with IS of drums and flutes followed by a station ID by a YI in French. Next, an Om talked in vernaculars. There was none of the usual bright tribal music, just non-stop talk with multiple Radio Mail ID's until fade-out at 0815. Signal was poor.
- 9635 MALI RTV du Mali, Bamako. 7/05/09 *0800-0820. Sign-on with flutes and drums . ID announcement by YI in French, who continued talking in vernacular until 0810, when some splendid tribal music was played. This was followed by an Om talking until 0820 fade out. Signal was poor.
- 9690 NIGERIA Voice of Nigeria 7/06/09 0815-0822 Om talking in listed Haus. Probably the usual newscast broadcast this time of day, but the signal was so ratty not much could be discerned. Band noise engulfed the weak signal by 0822.

- DJIBOUTI, Radiodiffusion du Djibouti, 0326-0348 fade out May 28, Horn of Africa vocals to ID, music fanfare and news in Arabic at 0331. Return to music programming after the news at 0342. Fair but marred by CODAR interference.
- 4800 MEXICO, XERTA Radio Transcontinental, 0342-04 15 Jun 4, man with ballad followed by man announcer with ID and announcements in Spanish and a second ID. More music until 0400 when a woman announcer spoke with an echo effect. After another song she gave station ID. Poor with slight CODAR QRM.
- 4845.2 BRAZIL, Radio Cultural Ondas Tropicais, 0007-0054 May 20, man with preaching in Portuguese language repeated by a woman. Religious vocals noted between long talk segments. End of program at 0050 with man talking over choir vocals. Studio ID by a man announcer. Fair.
- 5990 SLOVAKIA, IRRS via Rimavská Sobota, *0428-0437 Jun 4, inspirational instrumental music opening followed by a man announcer with opening ID and announcements in English. English language religious programming with choir vocals commenced. Fair.

- 6010 COLOMBIA, La Voz du tu Conciencia, 0347-0416 Jun 10, man with religious talk in Spanish language until group vocals at 0403. Man with distorted canned station ID at 0407 followed by another man with another religious talk. Fair to good.
- 6030 CANADA, CFVP Calgary, 0414-0500 May 18, peaked up over the noise with Country & Western music, local announcements and an "AM 1060" ID.Fair at peaks but mainly battling the noise floor with deep fades until an unidentified English language station opened with news at 0500.
- 6110 ETHIOPIA, Radio Fana, *0257-0325 May 29, IS followed by a woman announcer in Amharic with ID and announcements followed by a man with the news. Music fanfare at 0304 followed by piano music and then Horn of Africa instrumentals. Fair.
- PORTUGAL, Radio Deutsche Welle via Sines, *0400-0433 Jun 7, sudden opening with ID followed by news in English. Another ID at 0404 followed by Inbox program. Sport from 0430. Fair signal but splattering QRM from 6175.
- BRAZIL, Radio Nacional da Amazonas, 2345-0022 May 22, Brasilian pop music program hosted by a man announcer with Portuguese talks. ID at 2359 followed by news. Return to music program after the news. Fair to good with //11780 fair.
- 6250 EQUATORIAL GUINEA, Radio Malabo, 0520-0542 Jun 13, man announcer with Spanish talk hosting a program of music. ID by a man at 0531, another song before a long talk by a man and a woman. Poor.
- SUDAN, Sudan Radio (presumed), 0416-0426* Jun 4, studio male announcer with Arabic talk speaking to others from remote locations via telephone connection. Music fanfare at 0423 followed by a discussion by a man and woman in the studio. Carrier cut in mid-sentence. Fait to good.
- LITHUANIA, Radio Free Europe / Radio Liberty via Sitkunai, *0458-0520 May 30, Man in English with multiple IDs mixing with female vocals. Opened at 0500 with man in listed Tatar-Bashir language with news. Some music but mainly talks and interviews from 0505. Fair.
- 9780.2 YEMEN, Yemen Radio, 0407-0445 Jun 11, Middle Eastern style vocals program hosted by a woman announcer with Arabic talk. End of program at 0429 followed by ID by a woman and news by a man. After news returned to Middle Eastern style vocals program hoisted by a man announcer. Fair.
- 9895 CLANDESTINE (Zimbabwe), Radio Voice of the People via Talata-Volonandy, 0443-0456* May 29, man announcer interviewing another male about violence in Zimbabwe in English. Local vocals and more talks until closedown announcements including postal and electronic contact information plus website. Fair to good.
- O400 with instrumental music, man announcer with ID and frequency announcement in local language followed by the same in English. After instrumental music, a man gave the news in local language. Mix of short vocals and other features. Good.
- 11690 FRENCH GUIANA, Voice of Russia Montsinery, 2341-2357* May 19, short features hosted by a man announcer in the Portuguese language service with music fanfare, closing ID and carrier cut at 2357. Fair.
- 11735 ROMANIA, Radio Romania International, *1700-1723 Jun 8, opening English service to Europe with ID, opening announcements followed by the news read by a woman announcer. Recap of the headlines at 1704 followed by another ID: "You are listening to radio Romania International coming to you from Bucharest." A feature about WWII was next followed by local pop music.
- RUSSIA, Voice of Russia Petropavlovsk-Kamchatski, 0330-0400* Jun 12, classical music program hosted by a woman announcer in English. Program entitled Legends of Russian Sports at 0350. Program ended at 0358 with IDs and closedown announcements. Carrier cut at 0400 after instrumental music.
