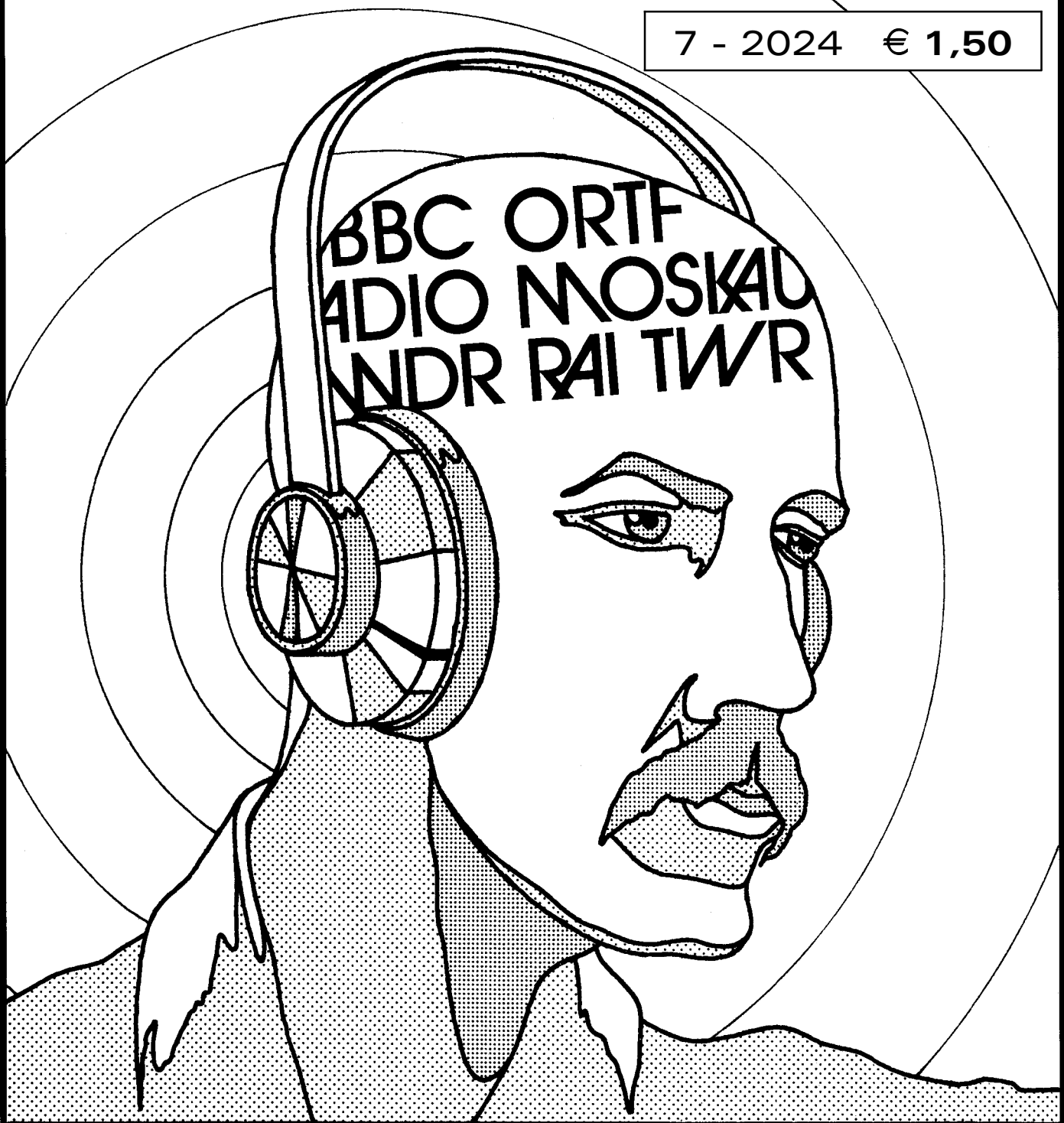


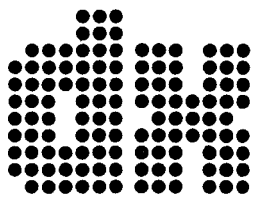

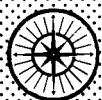

He says the coverage area is Southern Brazil and neighboring countries, including Mato Grosso do Sul, Goiânia, Paraguay, Uruguay and Misiones province of Argentina.

"Dear listeners, Due to increased solar activity, audibility on 5900 kHz from 17:00 to 17:30 UTC has deteriorated in recent months.

Our partners from the SpaceLine radio station (Kostinbrod, Bulgaria) suggested that we switch to the frequency 9790 kHz at the same time from July 1 until the end of the summer broadcast season.

Therefore, starting from July 1, a half-hour program of the Russian MRI Service will be broadcast on a frequency of 9790 kHz from 17:00 to 17:30 UTC. We are waiting for your reports on audibility at the new frequency!"

BURKINA FASO: Burkina Faso slams international media

In a continuing war of words against international media organisations waged by Burkina Faso, the country's national broadcaster RTB has broadcast an hour-long talk show accusing Radio France International, France 24, BBC, CNN, VoA, TV5 Monde and Reuters of spreading fake news and disinformation aimed at destabilising the West African nation.

The Burkina Faso media regulator, CSC, has suspended the operating licences of several of the western broadcasters.

One panellist, Boukary Nebié, a researcher at Yembila Abdoulaye Tougueni University, said these media outlets ought to have stuck to their role of "informing, educating and entertaining", adding that media plurality is a good thing for any country.

"But unfortunately, with these international media in our countries, this is not the role that these media play," Nebie said.

He added that Burkinabe journalists found themselves in trouble with France because of taking an opposing stance on the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

"France is not a model and Burkina Faso must rethink which model of journalism to adopt. The model of journalism that we have, it is not us who created it," he said.

Since a coup in 2022, the country has been led by Captain Ibrahim Traore who heads a military junta.

CHINA/ARCTIC: China has launched radio broadcasts for the safety of shipping lanes in the Arctic.

A radio station in northern China began broadcasting information about the current situation on Arctic waterways to ensure the safety of navigation, Xinhua reported on Tuesday.

It is noted that the radio station, located in the city of Tianjin in northern China, began broadcasting on Monday. The station, using satellite data, transmits information on ice thickness and weather forecasts in the Bering Strait, Dmitry Laptev Strait, Vilkitsky Strait, and the Kara Gate Strait.

Radio broadcasting will be conducted every year from July 1 to October 31 for single-sideband radiotelephones.

The agency notes that the launch of radio broadcasts will help fill the gap in information about maritime safety on Arctic shipping routes, thereby ensuring safe navigation for Chinese ships. 1prime.ru <<https://tele-satinfo.ru/>>

RUSSIA: Russia bans European media outlets - Association for International Broadcasting (AIB), 28 June 2024

Russia's Foreign Ministry has announced bans on a large number of media companies – broadcast, digital and print – based in EU Member States. The move is in response to the continuing bans in place in the EU that prohibit many Russian media outlets from being broadcast in EU Member States.

In a statement on 25 June, the Ministry said:

In response to the May 17 decision of the EU Council, banning broadcasting by three Russian media outlets, including RIA Novosti, Izvestia MIC and Rossiyskaya Gazeta, effective as of today, June 25, countermeasures are being introduced that limit access to broadcasting resources in the Russian Federation for media outlets of the EU member states and EU media operators that systemically spread false information about the special military operation.

The Russian side has repeatedly warned at various levels that politically motivated persecution of Russian journalists and unjustified bans on Russian media outlets in the EU will not go unanswered. This notwithstanding, Brussels and the capitals of the bloc's countries preferred to further escalate the situation. By imposing another illegitimate ban, they forced Moscow to introduce symmetrical and proportional countermeasures. Responsibility for these developments rests solely with the EU leadership and the countries of this association that support this decision.

The Russian side will revise its decision concerning the above-mentioned media operators if restrictions against Russian media outlets are lifted,

SLOVAKIA: RTVS is changing to STVR - President Peter Pellegrini believes that the law does not violate EU legislation

Bratislava (TASR) – Radio and Television Slovakia (RTVS) is changing to Slovak Television and Radio (STVR). The director will be elected by a nine-member council with four nominees from the Ministry of Culture (MK) SR. This follows from the STVR law, which was signed by President SR Peter Pellegrini on Sunday and came into effect on Monday. With the coming into effect of the law, the function of the current head of RTVS Luboš Machaj and the mandate of the members of the current RTVS Council have expired, TASR reports.

Pellegrini justified signing the STVR law by stating that, according to him, the legislation does not establish reasonable suspicions of inconsistency with the Constitution of the SR and does not infringe on freedom of speech. He also does not see any conflict with the current international standards that the SR is bound by. However, the President warned the government coalition that from August next year, the regulation of the European Parliament and the Council of the EU, which establishes a common framework for media services in the internal market and amends the directive called the European Media Freedom Act, will begin to apply.

“Therefore, it is the task of the government and parliament to properly assess the compliance of the adopted law with these future-binding European directives and to align them within the next 13 months in case of any doubts,” he noted.

The law was prepared by the Ministry of Culture. According to it, the legislation does not divide the public institution responsible for television and radio broadcasting, but creates conditions for the independent development of television and radio. “It brings a higher degree of depoliticization of processes in the election of the institution’s general director, the formation of the Council of Slovak Television and Radio, and introduces a new institute of the ethical commission, which will be an advisory body to the council,” it explained.

The changes were justified by the department with negative experiences resulting from the application of the RTVS law and comparisons of experiences from the functioning of public institutions abroad. According to it, the legislation also responds to suggestions from both the lay and professional public calling for the improvement of the current state of the institution.

The council will continue to have nine members as before. However, the way it is formed will change. The Minister of Culture will nominate four council members based on a selection process, and the remaining five will be elected by the National Council of the SR based on the proposal of the parliamentary committee for culture and media. The term of office for a council member remains six years.

The council will again have the competence to elect the general director of the television and radio based on a public hearing of the registered candidates. In case of compliance with the relevant provisions of the law, it will also be able to remove them. The term of office of the director will be extended from the current five to six years.

The advisory body to the council will be a nine-member ethical commission. It will oversee adherence to the ethical standards of journalistic work in the STVR and also propose measures to ensure their compliance. The members of the council are to be elected by the chairman of the council based on the nomination proposal of entities representing the various areas that should have representation in the ethical commission. The legislation also talks about the initial formation of the STVR bodies.

In terms of financing the STVR, the legislation respects the current state – the primary source is to be an entitled contribution of at least 0.12 percent of GDP.

SPAIN: RTVE Secures the Future of the Public Shortwave Service of Radio Exterior de España

The RTVE Board of Directors has unanimously approved the purchase, installation, and implementation of a new shortwave transmitter. This is the first of five new transmitters that Radio Exterior de España (REE) urgently needs to guarantee the continuity of this public service.

The new transmitters will replace the current equipment, which has far exceeded its useful life and whose frequent breakdowns put the continuity of shortwave broadcasts at risk. They will be responsible for carrying the shortwave signal to West Africa, the Middle East, North America, and South America.

With this decision, RTVE fulfills its public service obligation set out in the Framework Mandate and in Law 17/2006 of June 5, which establishes that the Corporation must "aim to serve the widest audience, ensuring maximum continuity and geographic and social coverage, with the commitment to offer quality, diversity, innovation, and ethical standards."

This is a great advance that ensures the continuity of REE's public service to Spaniards who are outside our borders and to foreigners interested in Spain. This commitment by the Corporation comes after years of uncertainty. In 2014, the closure of REE's shortwave was implemented for a few months. It was in 2018 that an eight-hour daily shortwave broadcast was achieved again.

REE's shortwave carries the voice and vision of Spain to the entire world. For this reason, the director of the station, Luis Manuel Fernández Iglesias, has advocated in his speech before the RTVE Board of Directors to "involve the Ministries of Foreign Affairs and Culture of Spain in the future of Radio Exterior, both in the design of its programming and in the financing of this public international broadcaster, such as REE."

As seen in the invasion of Ukraine, shortwave escapes control and censorship, guaranteeing the democratic right to truthful and honest information. Another advantage is its free nature for listeners and the low cost and investment needed for its reception anywhere. These circumstances make it very attractive, especially for fishermen, merchant seamen, missionaries, or Spanish volunteers who carry out their work where the internet signal does not reach.

21 June marks the longest night in Antarctica and a very special Midwinter's Day with 47 people or 'winterers' living and working at British Antarctic Survey's (BAS) three winter stations: Rothera on the Antarctic peninsula, and King Edward Point and Bird Island on South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands.

Midwinter falls when the sun is at its furthest point and some of the frozen continent will be experiencing 24 hours of darkness on its shortest day. The event has its roots from the historical age of exploration and while working through the Antarctic winter, or 'overwintering', is now much more comfortable, many of the traditions continue.

Homemade gifts are an important component of Midwinter celebrations and staff working in research stations will spend many hours using their crafting abilities to make unique and special presents, as there are no shops in Antarctica!

The last delivery of fresh produce to the stations will have been many weeks ago, however talented chefs work hard to create a multi-course Midwinter feast, rivalling any fine dining experience back in the UK.

Colleagues working in British Antarctic Survey's wintering stations will also receive a letter of thanks from the British Antarctic Territory's (BAT) Commissioner and the Commissioner of South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands.
