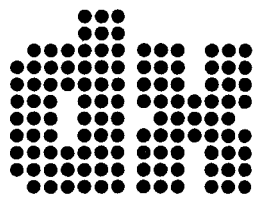

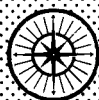

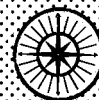

ALBANIA/GERMANY: Radio Tirana Listeners' Club closes after 32 years of existence.
Germany-based Radio Tirana Listeners' Club (Radio Tirana Hoererklub) closed on December 31, 2024.

The Club was founded on January 1, 1993 with the aim of supporting Radio Tirana in the difficult period after the end of the dictatorship with materials, especially QSL cards and program leaflets. Most of the almost 100 QSL motifs can be found at <https://www.wwdx.de/rthk/html/qls.html>

RTHK organized two listeners' meetings in Vienna in the early years as well as a trip to Albania in 2010. During its existence, the club issued 85 newsletters.

13885 {sic, rather 13855 kHz instead, WB.} ALGERIA Ifrikya FM, Berkaoui Ourgla{sic, Ourgla} site, 2315 kHz, Dec 27. French news type monologue by male announcer in French. // 13640 kHz Bechar site, both transmitters with the same moderate signal level.

From the start of A24 season, the schedule was 1710-1725 UT in Turkmen, 1725-1740 UT in Kazakh and 1740-1755 UT in Karakalpak. Radio Liberty left that frequency on March 30, 2024 (1430-1530 UT in Russian).

Those transmissions were moved to 1377 kHz, so the schedule on that frequency is, in UTC:

One of the two 350 kW TRAM transmitters that broadcast the Europe 1 programme from Saarlouison 183 kHz until 2019 is back in operation in Noratus on LakeSevan {or better known as Yerevan Gavar MW centre site of former R Moscow USSR radio, WB.}.

The transmitter now replaces a Soviet Borey transmitter on 1377 kHz. It is connected to a directional antenna system (-67, 127, 247 degrees) from Kintronic Labs {from 2006, WB.} and currently broadcasts religious programmes from Trans World Radio to Ukraine, Central Asia and Iran. The transmitter was previously converted for medium wave by the Broadcasting Centre Europe.

The target broadcast to Eritrea from **Radio Erena** is heard daily on 9585 kHz between 1700-1800. It is brokered by Encompass and relayed via Gavar in Armenia. When the programme ends just before 1800, the Encompass signature tune cuts in for a few seconds followed by the start of NHK World Japan in Persian, before it is abruptly cut. The NHK World Japan broadcast is actually scheduled to go out from Gavar on mediumwave 1395 kHz instead from 1800. By contrast, on 1395 kHz the feed for Radio Erena often cuts in prior to 1800, followed by the Encompass signature tune, before NHK World Japan in Persian starts up as scheduled. So Radio Erena and NHK World Japan can be briefly heard unexpectedly on both 1395 and 9585 kHz!

A lot of pounding drums, wind instruments, and chanting; woman presenter in (listed) Kanuri lang. Really strong, heard with indoor wire fed to SW-2000629. Broadcast directed to African Lake Chad region. Very Good on Jan 16.

12050 kHz {target radio} Radio Ndarason International via BBC site and ENC operated Ascension relay (or ENC-Woofferton-UK, also listed?), 1950 UT on Jan 24; good signal with OM talks in Kannuri and thank goodness, heard in absence of EWTN Vandiver. Both stns usually there at this time and on a direct zero beat, so one can pleasantly listen to Ndarason but must apply what ECS used to call "the cerebral filter". This should continue improve all the way to listed -2100* UT.

AUSTRIA: ORS shortwave transmitter ORS Moosbrunn is history

On 28 January, and three days earlier than announced, a targeted blast put an end to the mighty rotating antenna of the ORS shortwave transmitter in Moosbrunn near Vienna. ORS has thus completed the final dismantling work at the Moosbrunn shortwave transmitter site. The site will now be handed back to ORF.

The transmitter station, which was built from the 1950s onwards, played an important role in the broadcasting of Radio Austria International (ROI) to Australia, New Zealand, Russia, China and the Middle East, particularly during the Cold War.

With the emergence of other technologies for broadcasting radio programmes, such as satellite broadcasting and internet-based transmissions, shortwave broadcasting became less important.

Until 31 December 2024, the shortwave transmitter still served some international radio customers by lease.

Shortly before the demolition, Bernhard Boneberg launched a petition on the Internet platform change.org to preserve the transmitter. Around 2,600 people had signed the petition by the time the circular went to press. It was unsuccessful - even though the petitioner emphasised the transmitter as an important technical structure and argued that it was a loss to Austria's cultural and technical heritage [1].

According to information from Radio Voz Missionaria, the transmitters and respective antennas that operate at frequencies of 5940 and 9665 kHz are undergoing maintenance services, with no set return date.

"Hi Glenn, Radio Voz Missionaria announced last week that its transmitters and antennas at 9665 kHz and 5940 kHz would undergo technical maintenance, which is why these frequencies would be off the air for the time being.

I hope that, especially, the frequency of 5940 kHz will be 'purified' of its spurious signals above and below its usual frequency, which greatly interfered with reception on some other frequencies.

CHINA: Over the past few weeks of monitoring of CRI, I note that just as CRI has the music only German, Hungarian, Polish, and Portuguese transmissions, a similar thing has occurred to their Russian output. While it has not gone all-music, they seem to be repeating a feature about tofu and its history, certainly on an every hour basis between 1200 UT to 1600 UT every day on all frequencies.

The only exception is New Year greetings from Xi. All that seems quite stupid to me as they could at least relay CGTN Russian TV channel audio on SW. However, if they can afford repeating the same stuff, let it be.

We just heard the first Firedrake / Firedragon jamming music station in many many months on 11590 kHz, just in its last two minutes. There were CNR type pips at 1600 UT and off. Huge China powerhouse signal. This fqy is listed used by Radio Free Asia, so that is likely the reason for the jamming. Those interested may want to check this channel tomorrow. (Rick in Arizona-USA, wor Febr 1)

Voice of Xinjiang also comes on in English at 1600 UT on 4905 kHz, 4920 kHz and sometimes on 6200 kHz as well. Which is generally a repeat of their 0700 UTC broadcast on those frequencies but also 9490 kHz which I have heard from Dimapur or Delhi kiwi on the SDRs located there.

6165 kHz **CNR6 Voice of Shenzhou** (Divine Land per Wikipedia) via Beijing Chaoyang. 1135 UT t/in with ballads, soft-spoken but occasionally long-winded M+W; weak as fading in; F at 1215 UT recheck. // 11775 kHz via Nanning, with better signal, G but flutter. Reportedly the second service to Taiwan, along with CNR5 Cross-Strait Radio. 31 Jan.

7335 kHz **CNR2** via Baoji Sifangshan, Shaanxi per EiBi database. 2345-2400* UT Distinct Chinese M and W at times. So, that's a fifth frequency heard here from CNR2 in the 2300 UT block, including 6000, 6065, 7370 and 9820 kHz. 30 Jan.

CHINA {TIBET / Xizang province}: 6200 kHz 1658- UT, Hello Xizang Jan 22

What was formerly Holy Tibet was coming in very well this hour, and improving throughout. Strongest of many frequencies available. An interesting song at the end, with a bit of rap included! No ID via Shazam. Into time pips at 17:00 UT and presumed ID. Not 100% sure that it's Tibetan, though, and not Mandarin.

Other channels heard: 4905 kHz (good), 4920 kHz (good, apart from occasional digital hash between 4922 and 4924, 6025 (fair), 6130 kHz ... not sure whether it's them due to huge adjacent 6125kHz splatter, 6110 (poor/fair), 7255 kHz (would be good, except for cochannel CRI English!), 7385 kHz (listed, but another program heard here). Excellent reception this morning, January 25th on the 60 meter channels.

4905 kHz 1600-UT, Hello Xizang Jan 24 Very strong reception this morning. Time pips, 6 seconds late, then into IDs, but not a word about Tibet. News in English. Mostly economic propaganda. We had a very windy night. This morning all my antennas are quite noisy with frequent static crashes. Once it's light, I'll have to check my antenna farm, although I suspect some branches on power lines somewhere. However, there is a lot of lightning activity especially north of Hawaii, Eastern Australia, and just to the east of Japan (via lightningmaps.org).

This channel is strongest of the various other frequencies on 4, 6, and 7 MHz. 4920 kHz also about as strong. Excellent modulation. News continued (yawn) until 16:19 UT. They then gave email and website addresses, then into Tibetan music. Very distinctive. Noticed at the same time some digital hash between 4901 and 4903 kHz, so had to switch to SAU to avoid that.

I then switched over to 6200 kHz which was much quieter and just as strong. Temperature in Lhasa was minus 18 deg. Tourism section of Hello Xizang follows at 16:25 UT, but with the same heavily accented female we usually hear. She mentions the only Catholic church located in Xizang, Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Church in Yerkalo. Then salt

A LONG AWAITED QSL ISSUED 5 YEARS AGO.

The Democratic Republic of Congo is in the headlines across world media after a recent escalation of fighting in the eastern of the country, which has seen new areas taken over by M23 rebels, encircling and taking control of parts of Goma, the capital of the North Kivu province. Adjacent to this area is located the city of Bukavu which is home for Radio Kahuzi, a U.S.- funded religious station that some years ago was also active on short waves (In the recent past there were rumours of a possible re-introduction of a short wave transmitter). Our reader Eckard Roscher heard the station and sent a reception report in January 2020 and never received a reply.

Recently, he has finally realized that he was wrong. Here is the short story:

"Two friends of mine, Bernhard Hein and Simon-Peter Liehr, went to North Denmark for DX nearly every year. We visited Wilhelm Herbst in Fjerritslev. He is the author of DX-books like "99 days medium wave". And he installed Beverage antennas in all directions of the world in his area. It is a very nice place for DX. In January 2020 we stayed in Fjerritslev. We also listened to Radio Kahuzi and different other radio stations. I sent my reception report to the snail mail address of Kahuzi in Florida with return postage (some Dollars). But I didn't get any reply. I sent different reminders, the last one in December 2020 with a little donation. I didn't get any reply from Kahuzi.

At the end of last year I got an information about a special DX-program from the ADXB Austria. Harald Suess was one of the creators of this special program for their 10th Anniversary, that means 10 years DX-program from ADXB on HCJB. And there was a special information about Radio Kahuzi, that Kahuzi noted the DX-ers who wrote reception reports till the end of 2020. Of course I wanted see if I was noted on their homepage. So I found my e-QSL after 1832 days after my written reception report. I attach a postcard of the DX-house in Fjerritslev. Wilhem welcomes DX-er. And it is really a good place for DX !!!"

Well, it's really incredible! We hope that fighting in Congo cease immediately and that Radio Kahuzi will return soon back to S.W.

CUBA: 5025 kHz **R Rebelde**, 0559 UT on 14 Jan. Spanish. Poor signal with man and woman talking over light music, possibly on piano.

CZECH REPUBLIC: Gorilla, flamingos, rhinos and tigers: Zoo theme for 2025 series of amateur-radio QSL postcards.

Radio Prague International still sticks to tradition and comes up with a series of amateur-radio postcards every year.

"Every year we try to choose a topic that is connected with significant events in Czech history, as was the case last year, when we celebrated the Year of Czech Music, or we try to introduce interesting places, monuments and personalities. This year, in a summer series, we will focus on the largest Czech zoos and their unique rescue programmes, which is why we have chosen animals as the theme," says Klara Stejskalova, editor-in-chief of Radio Prague International.

Kristyna Markova is behind the graphic design. "This year, I decided to work with the QSL cards like a jigsaw puzzle. After collecting four animal illustrations, the image will be combined into a larger whole that depicts the biodiversity of zoos."

As many international radio stations have reduced their shortwave broadcasts, they have also stopped issuing QSL cards - postcards confirming reception to listeners. However, the constant price increases by the Czech Post have unfortunately forced us to send printed postcards since last year only to those listeners who send us a postcard or letter themselves. UNITED KINGDOM: BBC World Service London to cut 130 jobs in savings plan.

The BBC World Service has announced it will cut 130 jobs as part of a plan to save around £6m in the next financial year.

Planned cost-saving measures include closing posts in the UK and internationally as well as roles in BBC Monitoring, a division which reports and analyses news from media around the world.

The World Service was given a funding boost by the government as part of the autumn Budget, but financial pressures and the previous two-year freeze in the licence fee means the corporation's projected total deficit will increase to GBP_492 million for the 2024/25 financial year.

Despite the cuts, it said it will continue to provide journalistic coverage across its 42 language services.

Jonathan Munro, global director and deputy chief executive of BBC News, said: "While the result of the latest grant-in-aid funding settlement means we are able to maintain all of our existing language services, we were clear it would not stave off difficult decisions in order to remain globally competitive and meet our savings requirements.

"These changes will ensure we operate effectively with the resource we have, creating the most impact for audiences internationally."

The BBC added that the service is "operating in a highly competitive global media environment" which has "international news providers investing billions in state-backed media that sees increased competition for staff, platforms and frequencies, and audiences".

The broadcaster said it will "continue to counter disinformation, provide emergency services in times of crisis and report from all corners of the globe".

As part of the Budget in October, Chancellor Rachel Reeves announced that the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) settlement for the next financial year "provides an increase in funding to the BBC World Service, protecting existing foreign language service provision and its mission to deliver globally trusted media, in support of the UK's global presence and soft power".

The BBC World Service is predominantly funded by the UK licence fee and has received a grant of GBP_104.4 million from the FCDO in previous years.

I am receiving audio from RRI and other stations now using the xHE-AAC codec, but reception on 11630 kHz at 1800 UT is not great, as the signal often fades out after about 15 minutes, and I suspect that their choice of 11 MHz at this time of the year was not a good one. Their German, French and Italian DRM services on 7 and 5 MHz come through with excellent audio though.

I could not get my old version of Dream to decode the new codec, but downloaded a modified version from the drmr.org forum, but even that didn't work until by chance I downloaded a copy of the 'K-Lite mega codec pack', and now it is working a treat and I'm hearing good quality audio from a number of stations in this mode.

The modified version 2.2x can be found on this page if Dream is what you are using, if you are using a DRM radio then it may not work now unless it supports the xHE-AAC codec.

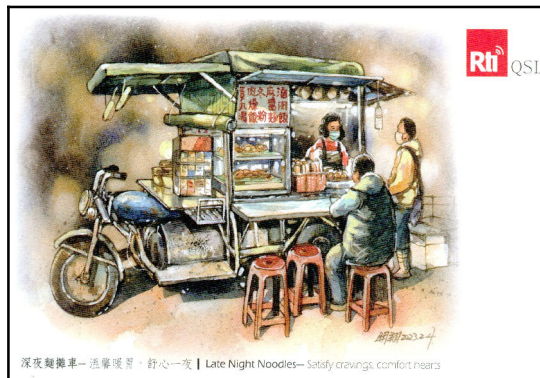

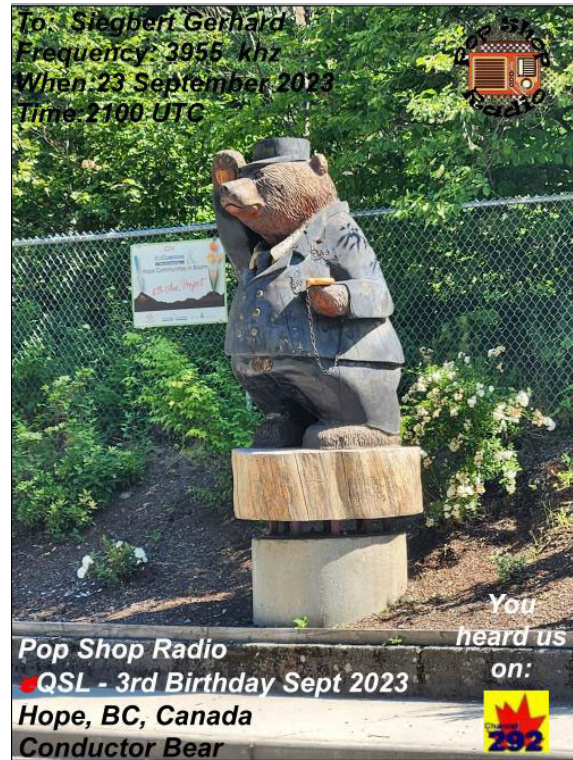
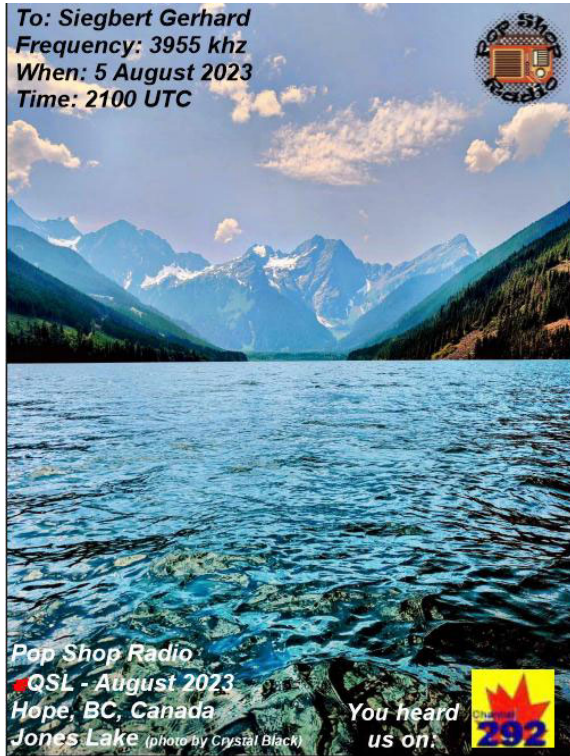
