



NEWS ABOUT BROADCASTING (+other) STATIONS

ALASKA: 9800 kHz KNLS religious broadcast in Russian to FE, Aug 30, at 1521-1530 UT, with POP MX. SIO 333. OM announcer with ID and contact information after POP MX. Increasing QRN. YL joins at 1526 UT with homily and / or news items about Putin and the Ukraine conflict. Long monologue.

ALBANIA: In August, the German section of Radio Tirana confirmed most of the previously unconfirmed reception reports from the last 2.5 years with seven different QSL motifs. I would like to draw particular attention to the listener mail-related broadcasts on Tuesday and Friday shortly after 1200 and 1430 UTC live on the Internet via the link <<http://www.agdx.de/tirana1.html>> or with some Internet radios and afterwards as a podcast at <<http://tirana.agdx.de>>. At present, reception reports can only be sent to the private email addresses of Juxhin <juxhinngjelina@gmail.com> or Kleidja <kleidja_pere@hotmail.de> and hopefully they will be confirmed with a QSL card.

ARMENIA/TURKEY: { 'Denge Gel' - target radio to all-KURDISTAN, in TUR/SYR/ARM/IRQ/IRN }

On May 12, 2025, the Kurdish PKK announced the end of its armed struggle against the Turkish state, which it had waged since 1984, and the dissolution of its organizational structures. The two-week shutdown of a Kurdish exile radio station and its Turkish jamming transmitter, observed in July 2025, seemed to fit this context. As of July 31, 2025, the cat-and-mouse game resumed. In contrast to much earlier times, the Kurdish radio station's broadcasting hours are limited to 4:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and to a frequency in the 11.5 MHz range.

On August 1, 2025, British shortwave expert Alan Holder_G4ZBH wondered, "Who is actually monitoring the situation? I suspect that someone in both Emirler (Turkey) and Gavar (Armenia) sites is monitoring the situation and making the necessary adjustments.

With 12 hours of daily broadcasting, it must be a rather arduous task to keep the situation under control. I noticed that the Armenian engineer is making the adjustments more quickly, as only one shortwave transmitter is in operation. With up to five transmitters broadcasting simultaneously at Emirler, the workload for the Turkish technician is greater. Hence the delays in tracking the Kurdish transmitter."

During our own monitoring over several hours on August 1, 2025, the part about the freedom from interference for several hours was certainly correct. Mostly, but at 14:18 UTC, 'Denge Gel' "voluntarily" switched for 45 minutes from an interference-free frequency to the shortwave of the jammer, also called Radio Erdogan because of the speeches of some shortwave enthusiasts.

'Denge Gel' repeatedly emitted other noises, but these were likely the transmitter's own products (high-pitched tones, chirping). They disappeared when the transmitter changed frequency. The jammer could also be observed on a different frequency in such cases.

During another attempt on September 1, 2025, the jammer seemed to be quite successful, as it covered most of 'Denge Gel' and then found it again within half an hour. However, at 04:30 UTC, it seemed to switch away. Because the Turkish pop program and the speech could not be clearly identified, the project was ultimately canceled.

During a third project on the morning of September 5, 2025, the Kurdish station repeatedly escaped the Turkish jamming for extended periods. It began after 06:00 UTC with 'Denge Gel' on 11530 kHz and Radio Erdogan on 11510 kHz. Starting at 6:45 a.m., the jamming station blocked 'Denge Gel' on 11530 kHz. At 7:05 a.m., the Kurdish station moved to 11540 kHz and was not blocked there until 7:59 a.m. 'Denge Gel' moved to 11550 kHz at 8:07 a.m. and remained undisturbed until the end of the continuous listening period, fading out after 9:00 a.m. +.

Regarding the program of 'Denge Gel': Every hour on the hour, there seems to be a detailed newscast (15 minutes!?). There were also longer spoken-word segments and Kurdish music throughout the rest of the hour. The jamming station's program consisted of the usual content (alleged Erdogan speeches, words on a background music, military music, the crackling of machine guns, Allah Akber chants, the Turkish national anthem), but also more pop music than the reporter had previously noticed.

Runs // SW 4835 kHz and good signals on both freqs. Correspondence this week from the station owner, Dave VK3ASE, indicates that for the past two months, he has been running both channels at 30 watts due to high power bills (normally 100+watt).

Theme IS, same announcement, IS, 1300 UT fanfare, ID in Dzonkha, distinctive string instrument with YL w/ program opening, OM singer w/distinctive music. Good.

AUSTRIA: Important information from Harald Suess-AUT: There is a second application for an MW licence in Austria with the RTR. The assigned frequency will be medium wave 1143 kHz. The station will broadcast from the Upper Austria area.

The test broadcast has been approved by the RTR (licensing authority in Austria) and has been scheduled for the period from 27 August 00.00 CEST to 29 August 24.00 CEST. If a licence is actually granted, the contact will open up and announce their contact details. I have also been informed that there will be special night-time broadcasts with programmes for DXers.

The selected frequency is practically empty except for two Spanish 5 kW stations. From Asia, the best case scenario would be the VoTadjik from Dushanbe-TJK appearing, most likely at the start of transmission at 02 UTC. If the licence application is successful, Austria will then have two licensed MW stations.

AZERBAIJAN: The oldest radio station in the country, Azerbaijan Radio, will continue to operate in a new office, and a modern complex will appear on the site of the old building.

The building of Azerbaijan Radio is being prepared for demolition. According to the press service of AzTV, the editorial staff will temporarily continue to work in the building of Azerbaijan Television. After dismantling, construction of a new facility will begin on the site. "How many floors will be in the new building of Azerbaijan Radio is still unknown. This will depend on the future situation and the number of employees," the press service clarified.

The history of Azerbaijan Radio goes back almost a century. The first broadcast took place on November 6, 1926, when the phrase "Attention, Baku speaking!" was heard from loudspeakers on the streets of Baku. {...} During the Soviet period, radio played a key role in preserving the language and cultural identity, and later expanded its activities by opening international editorial offices with programs in Turkish, Persian and Arabic.

Today, Azerbaijan Radio is part of the Azerbaijan Television and Radio Broadcasting CJSC and continues to be an important media platform, broadcasting 24-hour news and cultural projects. {...} <oxu.az> (via Anatoly Klepov-RUS, RUSdx #1358 via wwdxc BC-DX TopNews Sept 7)

21550even CHN **CNR1 jammer** of China mainland against 'Falun Gong' sect SOH origin from Taiwan site on 21550.066

kHz string - probably TWN string. S=7 at 08.20 UT.

21490even CHN **CNR1** stronger **jamming** signal S=8 at 08.23 UT on Sept 27, ahead of 21490.071 kHz likely Mandarin Chinese from SOH TWN origin.

Also JBA carrier on 18970 kHz too, no doubt the same at 22-10 UT. Also at 0148 UT carrier only on 15916 kHz; if on 15920 kHz could be another - against SOH-TWN - jammer.

One interesting aspect of Chinese jamming of SoHope is that it frequently stops and goes off their right at the top of hour no audio, no carrier and then resumes at about 2 minutes past the hour with a carrier and then audio at about 2 minutes 20-30 seconds. Transmitter sight changes for the jammer perhaps?

FRANCE: re Antennas blown down at TDF Selestet France

A six-tower Radio France-TDF MW antenna array west of Selestet, { Haut- Koenigsbourg near Strasbourg, WB. } France, was dismantled last week, according to the Derniere Nouvelles d'Alsace newspaper. The Selestet transmitter site was first used in 1952 (replacing {pre WW II installation, WB.} Brumath). Most recently, it transmitted on 1278 kHz for 'Radio Bleu Alsace' until it was shut down in 2015. I was told once that in its last few years, only three of the six towers were being used.

The towers could easily be seen from the nearby A35autoroute and the sight of six sets of blinking red lights was reassuring whenever I drove by. I noticed in July that several of the towers were no longer lit. There were several occasions when I would stop at the site and wonder what was inside the large, majestic transmitter building. There was no signage other than a small metal TDF sign on the drive into the complex.

Several houses surround the greenspace in front of the building. There was talk a couple of years ago that the city might put housing there, but according to the DNA_article the property still belongs to TDF.

Alan Pennington-UK posted all about it yesterday Sept 26 to the British DX Club:

"The biennial 'Mini Transat' single-handed yacht race (sponsored by La Boulangere) began on Sunday 21st September with 90 small (6.50m) boats sailing from Les Sables d'Olonne in France, with a destination on the first stage of the race, Santa Cruz de la Palma in the Canary Islands.

(The second stage is scheduled to begin from La Palma on 25th October, destination Guadeloupe, Caribbean.)

One feature of the race is participants use paper charts and only have a VHF radio (with around 10 mile coverage). But there is a daily shortwave broadcast in French and English giving them weather conditions.

Two frequencies are registered on HFCC.org database for these daily 'Mini Transat' (MT) weather forecasts at 1500-1600 UTC: 7340 and 17545 kHz (both 250 kilowatts from TDF Issoudun bcast center site). (...)

GERMANY: ShortwaveService in Kall-Krekel will end broadcasts on December 31, 2025

Dear remaining shortwave consumers,

It began on 25 November 2007 and will end on 31 December 2025: when he comes of age, we will release the rascal into freedom. 6005 kHz Kall-Krekel will be no more. Broadcasting on 3985 kHz will also be discontinued at the turn of the year. Further operation of 6085 is currently still being reviewed. Background: Most shortwave licences in Germany expire on 31 December 2025. Connection allocations are possible, but involve significantly higher costs (previously €1,500 for 10 years, in future €4,000 for 10 years). As there are fewer and fewer KW licences in Germany, the annual EMC contributions will also rise significantly, as the Federal Network Agency (BnetzA) allocates the total costs to all active allocations.

Without Lampertheim and a thinned-out Media Broadcast transmission schedule, this means a significant additional burden for the rest. In addition, there is a new VVRuFu, which has different requirements for media law than it did 10 years ago. And honestly: KW is really 'over' in our part of the world. Except for the egos of a few individuals: zero relevance. Neither in disaster control nor as a terrestrial radio broadcasting channel.

When I look at the number of RRs that still come in at all, 95% are 'via Twente SDR'. Come on, just listen to the web stream. It was a good time, and I'm a bit proud that we opened up the market for smaller players back then, even though the excesses were and still are often questionable.

With that in mind, enjoy the remaining 3.5 months of KLL. There will be no more QSLs. But at least the infrastructure will remain intact.

GUAM: Closure of KTWR Guam on 31 Oct 2025

"For nearly 50 years, TWR has proclaimed the Good News from a powerful shortwave station on Guam Merizo." However, in the summer of 2025, TWR had bad news for listeners and donors: "As valuable as the Guam station has been to the work of Trans World Radio, we have faced many challenges there in recent years, from the high cost of living on the island to the unsustainable workload of the staff and the constant strain on the equipment.

Another pressing issue is our aging transmitters, which are becoming increasingly vulnerable to unforeseen, catastrophic failures. We do not believe that raising funds to replace this expensive equipment would be a wise use of resources already needed in other areas of our work. After months of intense prayer, study, and discussion, TWR's global leadership unanimously decided to cease operations on Guam by October 31, 2025."

The HC100 shortwave transmitter, commissioned in 1995, or parts and other equipment could perhaps be relocated to TWR Eswatini-Swaziland, where HC100s are already in use. On the other hand, an attempt is being made to sell the two Thompson TRE2326 transmitters that arrived from Darwin, Australia, in the early 2010s. At 250 kW, these are somewhat oversized for the capabilities of a radio mission. Furthermore, the HC100s were specifically developed by the HCJB transmitter company with a view to costeffective and repair friendly operation by mission transmitters in developing countries.

The DX world immediately speculated whether KTWR would actually make it to the scheduled end of broadcasting at the end of October. In fact, the situation is somewhat unclear. For example, Bernd Seiser received a broadcast schedule dated May 2025 in response to a reception report. However, according to the HFCC registration, the transfer of broadcasts had already begun long ago.

This not only includes FEBC Manila and Reach Beyond Australia as upcoming partners, but also flexible booking options for shortwave stations in Uzbekistan and Tajikistan. Interestingly, there is no reference to the transmitter in Palau, which is also operated as a mission station. Below, this last available broadcast schedule for the past month is documented

for posterity:

The scenario appears to be as follows:

Tashkent for Korea, as it was already the broadcasting location of choice for the BBC and private North Korea programs.

FEBC Manila for China and Northeast Asia to Southeast Asia. Reach Beyond Australia for the area from Indonesia to India. It is assumed that not all of the broadcasting will find a new home.

Either because an organization is withdrawing from shortwave altogether, or because the programs were already included in the schedules of other locations. It is also important to note that many of the traditional/ renowned radio organizations that were still committed to "the world up to the year 2000" and were able to be won over as sponsors of foreign languages no longer exist today.

Closure of DXers Diary and KTWR Guam on 26 October 2025

After nearly five years of dedicated service to the global DXing community, DXers Diary - the SW DX program from Trans World Radio (TWR) - will air its final edition on October 26, 2025, at 1500 UTC on 15390 kHz in DRM mode (broadcast time / kHz subject to change).

This farewell coincides with the closure of KTWR Guam on October 31, 2025.

First launched on January 6, 2021, DXers Diary quickly earned a respected place in the hearts of SW listeners. The weekly five-minute program, created and presented by Arun Kumar Narasimhan, VU2BBF of Chennai, India, became a source of DX news, listener loggings, and station profiles. Originally broadcast in AM mode and later in DRM, the program was transmitted via KTWR Guam, and also for short periods from Erevan, Madagascar, Tashkent and UAE. Radio Republik Indonesia Marks 80 Years of Public Service.

Employees of public broadcaster RRI took part in a ceremony marking the institution's 80th anniversary at the RRI headquarters in Jakarta on Thursday, September 11, 2025.

Radio Republik Indonesia is the country's only national radio station owned by the government. It was officially founded on September 11, 1945, a date now commemorated as National Radio Day in Indonesia.

RRI was established following a meeting of delegates from six radio stations at the home of Adang Kadarusman, where Dr. Abdulrahman Saleh was appointed as the organization's first general director.

Prior to RRI's founding, Indonesia's first radio broadcast was launched by Bataviasche Radio Vereniging (BRV) on June 16, 1945 from the Hotel des Indes in Batavia (now Jakarta).

During the Dutch East Indies era, several private radio broadcasters emerged, including NIROM (Nederlandsch-Indische Radio Omroep), SRV (Solossche Radio Vereniging), and MAVRO (Mataramse Vereniging Voor Radio Omroep).

Among these, NIROM was the most extensive, receiving full support from the Dutch colonial government. Meanwhile, SRV, founded in 1933 by Mangkunegoro VII and engineer Sarsito Mangunkusumo, pioneered Indonesian-led radio broadcasting.

Radio broadcasting in Indonesia continued to evolve.

During the Japanese occupation beginning in 1942, Japan seized Dutch-owned stations and consolidated private broadcasters under a centralized system known as Hoso Kanri Kyoku. Its main station was located in Jakarta, with branches in cities such as Bandung, Yogyakarta, and Surabaya. These stations primarily served as tools for Japanese propaganda. However, broadcasts ceased following Japan's surrender in August 1945.

On September 11, 1945, representatives from eight former Hoso Kyoku stations met with the Indonesian government in Jakarta and officially founded Radio Republik Indonesia.

The station was presented to the President and the government as a means of communication between the state and its citizens.

The station's closure was a continuation of President Lee Jae-myung's policy aimed at easing the situation and finding ways to dialogue with Pyongyang. Radio "Voice of Freedom" first went on air in May 2010 - as a response to the sinking of the South Korean corvette "Cheonan", which, according to Seoul, was sunk by a North Korean submarine.

Since then, the radio station has become an important tool of information pressure: its broadcasts included reports on events in the world and on the Korean Peninsula, including information about the dispatch of North Korean troops to Russia last year.

However, it is by no means the case that only the USA is rethinking its donation practices.

According to current estimates, 'Radio Dabanga' will also no longer receive funding from the Netherlands and will cease operations in January 2026. In this context, the station launched a charm offensive in August 2025. Numerous Dutch media outlets (De Volkskrant, NPO Radio 1, among others) reported on the important work of the information provider from and to Sudan.

Co-founder Leon Willems did not want to play one off against the other: "The focus [of European interest] is on Gaza strip Palestine, Ukraine, and our own problems. That is all justified. But Sudan must also be in focus."

Editor-in-Chief Kamal Elsadig was apparently less diplomatic - A press report stated: " 'Radio Dabanga' is the only independent news source for millions of Sudanese. The question is, for how long? Funding is drying up, and it is becoming increasingly difficult to connect with people in this famine- and war-stricken country. [...]

The war in Sudan is a 'forgotten conflict', to which Western media and politicians pay relatively little attention. This is partly because the West has virtually no direct interest in Sudan. It does not supply weapons to warring parties and does not maintain close economic ties with the country."

NIGERIA: Work to restore Voice of Nigeria SW transmitter commenced:

The Federal Government has commenced the restoration of the Voice of Nigeria (VON) shortwave transmission, with work set to begin on the 250 kW TX2 transmitter at the Lugbe transmitting station in Abuja.

The Minister of Information and National Orientation, Mohammed Idris, represented by the Permanent Secretary, Ogbodo Chinasa Nnam, flagged off the project on Monday [25 August], describing it as a landmark step in reviving Africa's largest and most powerful transmission station, now set to operate with modern, digitally compatible technology.

Idris commended President Bola Tinubu for prioritizing the upgrade of Nigeria's broadcasting infrastructure, noting that the project will reposition VON as a global radio brand and significantly transform terrestrial broadcasting in the country.

He urged the contractor to deliver the project on time and to the highest standards, while charging the VON technical team to show diligence in supervising the execution. The minister further encouraged VON to maintain its role as a pro-Nigeria and pan-African station dedicated to telling positive stories about Nigeria and the continent.

My observation is, that their programmes are generally biased towards patriotism. Their schedule is Saturday and Sunday 1900 "until early in the morning". They give the transmitter power as 20 kW, which would explain the strength, but they will not disclose even the country where the transmitter is located.

On 3 September 2025, the shortwave station published a broadcast schedule that now showed the World Radio Network's collection of English-language foreign programmes in many of its slots. In the context of these changes, there was also a two-hour broadcast block from Radio Prague International, including German:

01:00-03:00: 7780 & 9455 kHz: French. 01:30 English. 02:00 Spanish. 02:30 German.

However, it became apparent that the broadcast directions to western North America and Mexico were not suitable for direct reception in Europe.

Then in daytime Sept 5 at 14.34 UT, WLRC still absent from 9330 kHz direct, so at 14.47 UT I try the NH remote, and there they are: slightly out of calibration but obviously both still offset-minus as required at WBCQ: 6160- kHz S9 // 5130- kHz S7 with WLRC haughty Britaccent, and canned ID at 15.00 UT still claiming to be on 9330 kHz - what do they know? Beyond the Earth being Flat?


