CHAD - 4904.97 RNT. In a newscast on Radiodiffusion Nationale Tchadienne on Jan 16 the head of the station's technical department gave some details about the new shortwave transmitter which has now been put into use. It's a 250 kW unit which he described as being of "new generation" technology.

He mentioned that the following frequencies will be used: 4905, 6165, 9615 and 11760 (??) kHz. As 4905 kHz can be monitored mornings and evenings/nights, I suppose the others are for daytime services. (Christer Brunstroem-SWE, dxld Jan 19)

4904.97, RNT, *0433-0443+, Feb 8, sign on with National Anthem. Opening French announcements at 0434. French talk & Afro-pop music. Fair signal. (Brian Alexander, PA, DXLD)

4904.9 at 0521 UT on Feb 8th noted with Afro-pop music and talk; audio quite muffled so it was difficult to identify the language. Might this be Chad returning to the air after the coup-related interruption? (Jim Ronda, Tulsa, OK, DXplorer Feb 8)

Radio France Internationale (RFI) noted on 8 February that Radio Tchad was also broadcasting locally in Ndjamená on its usual frequency of 98.05 FM. It said that alternative studios were now being used, after the station's former premises were looted and burnt during the recent fighting. The French news agency AFP on 7 February said Radio Tchad was now being hosted in the offices of a private radio station inside Ndjamená's grand mosque.

AFP had reported on 5 February that national television returned to the air that day. (Source: BBC Monitoring research

BTW, Guápiles, Cantón de Pococí is in the Eastern Province of Limón

CYPRUS - 9760, Cyprus BC Corp, Limassol, *2215-2245*, Jan 26, Sign on with Greek music. Greek folk music. Greek talk. Good signal at sign on but deteriorated to a very weak signal strength by sign off. // 7210-mixing with China Radio International [via ALBANIA]. Both in at equal levels. // 6180-weak under Brazil. Fr-Su only (Brian Alexander, PA, DXLD)

EGYPT - Although I was hearing R. Cairo via ABZ site on 6290 some minutes before 2400 UT Feb 9 as I tuned by, at 0005 Feb 10 I found a strong carrier, but extremely weak and distorted modulation on 6225, nothing on 6290. 0000 is when the Arabic service is scheduled to switch 6290 from ABZ to ABS site, the latter with its terrible modulation, as we have noted before, and also with a considerable overlap between the two sites. This time on 6225, there was some yelling and applause, but the modulation so weak and distorted I could not even be sure of language, let alone pull a definite ID, but circumstantially it appears that Cairo has moved from 6290 to 6225 for the service after 0000, which remains a total waste. We shall hear subsequently whether this was a mistake, fluke, or permanent change. (Glenn Hauser)

EQUATORIAL GUINEA - 6250.0, R. Nacional, Malabo, 0602+ Feb 14 heard what sounded like timesignal, but surely not that far off; fair with ute QRM. 0604 R. Malabo ID, frequency 6250, news. 0607 mentioned 6250 again and 20 kW power, something about ``emisiones de prueba`` -- test transmissions; news sounders frequently, timecheck at 7:08, news of EqG, 0611 TC for 7:12 ``hora oficial de la República de Guinea Ecuatorial`` (Glenn Hauser, OK, DXLD)

ETHIOPIA - R Ethiopia is a commercial government station. Re. 5990/7110/9704: From 1400 hours onwards I noted that 5990 first mixed with co-channel VOIRI and is then completely lost under them. I never managed to hear 9704 during my trip, probably due to skip.

The new Oromo Service on 6030, identifying as "Radio Oromia", is on the air daily at 0400-0600, 0900-1100 and 1600-1800. Excellent reception everywhere, must be 100 kW.

The English programme in the Home Service is now a full hour, viz. Mo-Fr 1400-1500.

In the course of 2008, new MW relays are planned at Nazret (10 kW on 1035) and Nekemte (100 kW on 1053). The Robe relay will be completely rebuilt and the new 100 kW transmitter will shift from 972 to 837 kHz after completion. The antennas will be built by Colton Tower Consultants Inc., and Harris will supply the transmitters.

Mr. Melesse Edea Beyi is the head of the English language programme in the Home Service as well as the programmes in English, French and Arabic of the External Service. Somali is now aired at 0700-0800 and 1200-1300, Tigrayan at 1500-1530 and Arabic at 1400-1500 and 1530-1600. The Afari, English and French programmes are still broadcast as per schedule. In addition to 7165 and 9560, 989 MW is also used for the Addis Ababa region.

R Fana now has two 100 kW transmitters, both on 6110 and 7210. Their 5970 appears to be inactive. In a month or two, the station will increase its broadcasting time to 18 hours daily.

Mr. Fre Tesfamichael has left the Voice of the Tigray Revolution. Mr. Abera Tesfay has succeeded him as director. He told me that since May 2007 they have been using a 100 kW transmitter. It is located near Addis for better nationwide coverage. The two old 10 kW transmitters at Mekele will remain as standby. I was told that they simultaneously broadcast on two frequencies from the new transmitter. I expressed my surprise about this, but I am a technical layman, so who knows! They are still in a testing phase. Their assigned frequencies are: 5950, 5980, 6170 and 7155. I frequently heard the combination 5950 and 6170, but they were often silent altogether. They broadcast 66 hours a week in Tigrayan and 9.5 hours in Afari. They are now busy moving to a brand new building. An FM relay is projected for Mekele, but there are no plans to use MW.

Before popping in at this station, I visited the impressive monument and nearby museum, dedicated to the long and bloody struggle of the TPLF (Tigrayan People's Liberation Front) against Mengistu's Derg (junta). In the museum I also saw the old transmitter and antenna which had been used for some years in a cave in the Simien Mountains at an altitude of over 3500 m. when they were still a clandestine station. There was only one narrow path to the cave and all supplies had to be taken up via this tough route. They even carried up anti-aircraft guns and so the station was never silenced by the Derg. Mr. Abera and the director of PR, Mr. Berhaie, told me of the hardships they had to endure in the cave, such as the cold up there. Before every broadcast they had to heat the frozen cooling liquid for the transmitter! (Maarten Van Delft, visiting Ethiopia, DSWCI DX Window Feb 6 via WORLD OF RADIO 1394, DXLD)

GABON - Africa # 1 from Libreville was stronger than ever on 15475, covering the football match between Cameroon and Zambia, for the Cup of Africa Nations. A local power outage here helped a lot, with only little atmospheric noise detected. (Raúl Saavedra, Costa Rica, Jan 26, DXLD)

S9 +18 with the only comparable signal at this late hour on 49m being WBOH 5920, which was only S9 +13 but sounds louder due to overmodulation. XEPPM has a nice clean easily readable signal, and I wonder how long it will stay on; still going at 1610 tune-out. I also wonder how far into El Norte it can penetrate during the daytime. Hans Johnson was hearing it at 1657 via a DX Tuner in Pennsylvania; when I rechecked at 1727, nothing heard.

If they can do this with 10 kW, how nice it would be if they had 50 kW and deliberately broadcast in the daytime when there is zero co- or adjacent-channel interference! BTW, this has happened previously on Mondays, but not sure if that is their doing, or just when I have happened to notice it.

RADIO SWEDEN TO END ITS GERMAN SERVICE AFTER 69 YEARS

Radio Sweden has confirmed that its German service, which has been on the air for 69 years, will close at the end of March. Within international broadcasting, some languages, including German, have had a breakthrough on the Web and through podcasting, but the number of listeners, especially on shortwave, has dropped dramatically in recent years. It is this development which has figured in the decision of Swedish Radio management to suspend German broadcasts on shortwave and mediumwave. SR International retains, however, German for a basic service of news on the Web and as a Monday to Friday podcast. English is not affected and not in danger of being taken off the air. Summary of this programme:

Only three editors are left after the former head of the German service went away and SR International got no permission to hire a new employee because SR has to save money. But why have other language services more staff members than before now? No real answer by IL, just "SR must save money" mantra.

How does SR know that the listeners numbers have "dramatically" declined in recent years although no such surveys had been made for years? IL: "I must pass, I'm not able to answer this question." [!!!]

Dieter Weiland, the former head of the German service, left SR primarily due to an impression that the prospects for this service were grim. The leadership of SR had signalled over years that Germanis of little interest for them. IL: Can't confirm this impression, but is rather new to this position and not able to comment decisionslike cancelling Estonian and Latvian that had been made before he assumed office. The reason given for this decision was that these services were meant to promote democracy. From such a point of view German would be obsolete already since autumn 1989. This question would have to be answered by the leadership of SR, but they refused an interview request.

Btw., Radio Sweden repeatedly stated that the last German program will be aired on March 30. It remains to be seen whether or not this is a persistent mistake.

It might be also of interest that NDR 1 Welle Nord, the Schleswig-Holstein station of Norddeutscher Rundfunk (Kiel broadcasting house), broadcasts every Thursday at 21:05 local time a coproduction with Radio Sweden, called Ostseemagazin (as linked on their webpages). This illustrates how popular this service actually is, and I simply don't believe the claim that listeners figures have "dramatically declined", since SR fails to provide any evidence from audience research. It's as much a blow as the end of German from the BBC was back in 1999. And I can't resist from the cynical speculation that RFI could be next, if not some station of a former Warsaw Pact country throws in the towel before. (Kai Ludwig, Germany, Feb 11, dxldyg via DXLD)

ANOTHER SHORTWAVE STATION COMING IN TENNESSEE; KAIJ TO RESUME.

George McClintock tells me he has filed an application for a new shortwave station near Nashville, TN. He is the former GM and still a partner at WWCR, and also has been managing KAIJ near Dallas. On January 31, FCC accepted the application for filing, the first step.

Studio will be in Murfreesboro TN, the same location from which KAIJ has been programmed; transmitter site at Lebanon TN. Lebanon and Murfreesboro form a triangle with Nashville, east and southeast of it.

The application calls for one Harris SW100 transmitter to a rhombic at 50 degrees, which will cover Europe as well as parts of Africa, and the USA. Further plans are for a total of two or three transmitters; the application can be amended if necessary.

The company is called Leap of Faith, Inc., get it? And the preferred call letters would be WLOF, altho these are currently held by a religious FM station in Attica, New York, on 101.7. They would have to agree to WLOF also being used by a station on another band, which is technically allowed, but seldom authorized by FCC; or might be willing to relinquish the calls.

It is difficult to predict exactly when the new station would start broadcasting, but it could take some three months to grant the CP and at least another two months to build it.

Some clients have already been lined up. 'WLOF' would not be totally religious, but would have programming from political and other entities which have not been on SW before. Political programming would likely skew to the right of center, simply because there is not much money or interest on the Left in SW broadcasting. The station could be useful in the 2008 presidential campaign, as soon as it can be on the air. George credits his experience with KAIJ in developing new sources of shortwave programming and revenue, never explored before, a good experiment.

As for KAIJ itself, owner Mike Parker says it will definitely be returning to the air, but not known exactly when. Operational rather than technical problems are causing the delay. At least initially, it will probably resume programming as before, run out of the Murfreesboro studio, altho Parker will be taking care of further sales and programming development there, with George handling engineering. The Dallas lawyer's website gh uncovered mentioning KAIJ in a bankruptcy proceeding took place several years ago, not recently. KAIJ's webstream is supposed to be active again, following crashes of two computers handling it. (Glenn Hauser-OK-USA, dxld Jan 31)

VENEZUELA - More about my visit to Venezuela. Radio Nacional of Venezuela is now involved as I explained during the weekend edition of DXers Unlimited, in a wide-reaching nation-wide expansion and modernization of its broadcast facilities; that includes the installation of a large number of FM broadcast band transmitters to increase the coverage even to the most remote locations.

The installation of several new AM broadcast transmitting stations is also now in the works, using solid state transmitters and highly efficient folded monopole vertical antennas. Most of the new AM broadcast band sites will be serving two of Radio Nacional of Venezuela's national programs, by means of a diplexer arrangement that allows using the same antenna system for transmitting two different AM band frequencies. This is a very sound and economical approach that has been used for a long time by AM stations around the world, and now it is even a more efficient approach thanks to the use of the vertical folded and grounded monopole antennas, that also provide additional protection for the solid state output modules of the modern transmitters.

So, in the not too distant future, I am sure that DXers in South America, the Caribbean, Central America and North America will be able to pick up the new Venezuelan AM transmitters broadcasting Radio Nacional of Venezuela different programs, as several of these sites will be using power outputs in the 10 to 50 kiloWatt range the kind of power that makes possible frequent DX pick up from distances of more than one or two thousand miles away.

But there is still more good news for short wave listeners around the world from Radio Nacional of Venezuela: their international service, CANAL INTERNACIONAL, is also part of the broadcast expansion plans, and a new short wave transmitting station is now under construction there. The new installation will include a 50 kiloWatt transmitter to be operated on the 60 meters Tropical Band, and five 100 kiloWatts short wave transmitters to be operated with several antenna arrays.

The new transmitting station is located in the State of Guarico, and the antenna systems will include several high gain curtain arrays and also quadrant type omnidirectional antennas for short and medium range coverage. The new transmitters are of the pulse step modulation type, and very efficient from the point of view of energy conversion, that is that they are capable of producing a 100 percent modulated signal with much less electricity than what is required for a high level plated modulated transmitter.

The Radio Nacional of Venezuela engineering department is in charge of the project and it is expected that the first transmitter may be on the air pretty soon. The new Venezuelan international broadcasting facility is going to be one of the most modern and energy efficient installations in the Americas, and its antenna systems were designed with coverage of the Americas as the prime target area, but as expected, it may be heard around the world when propagation conditions are good.

The old Venezuelan Radio Nacional 50 kiloWatt transmitter on 9540 kHz may also soon be back on the air on that traditional frequency that has been in use by the station for many years. At the present time Radio Nacional of Venezuela Canal Internacional is broadcasting via the Radio Cuba transmitters outside Havana, according to an agreement between the two nations.
