Hello again,

Welcome to the first issue of our DX MAGAZINE in this new year 2009. Let me take this opportunity to wish you a very happy, healthy and successful year. Additionally, let me thank all of you who have paid their membership/subscription fees for the year 2009 recently and especially those who have added a donation for the club to their payment. Many thanks also to all of you who have ordered the new WORLD RADIO TV HANDBOOK 2009 from us. This also helps to keep our membership fees stable for another financial year.



OM Mathias Kropf, Germany, has just released his **2008 Clandestine Activity Survey**: During the year 2008 the activity of political clandestine stations broadcasting on shortwave has dropped by 5.3 % to 1251 Weekly Broadcasting Hours (WBHs). This is the result of the latest Clandestine Activity Survey, which has been published annually since 1986.

The activity of clandestine stations broadcasting to target areas on the Asian continent has decreased by 2.6 % to 915 WBHs. Activity to target areas on the American continent has remained unchanged at 215 WBHs. The activity to target areas on the African continent, where volatility has always been very high in recent years, has decreased by 27.5 % to 121 WBHs.

The most active target area worldwide is now - for the first time in the history of the CAS - North Korea with 245 WBHs (+49 when compared with last year), followed by China P.R. with 224 WBHs (-16) and Cuba with 215 WBHs (unchanged).

The number of different target areas active worldwide has decreased from 18 to 17, with Senegal dropping from the list of active targets. On the other hand, no new or reactivated target areas have been reported over the past 12 months. (Mathias Kropf, E-Mail <100144.232@compuserve.com>)

AZERBAIJAN [and non] - AZERBAIJAN SINCE THE BAN OF FOREIGN RADIO ON FM. Kai Ludwig in Germany notes that the RFE/RL Azerbaijani Service, known as Radio Azadliq, is only using one shortwave frequency, 9485 kHz, at 1600-1700 UTC, according to the RFE/RL transmission schedule <<http://www.rferl.org/howtolisten/AZ/ondemand.html>>

Kai adds: "This single shortwave transmission had been reintroduced at the beginning of the B08 season [25 October 2008], I suspect as a precaution because the end of the rebroadcasts in Azerbaijan was already looming. I would have expected the amount of shortwave airtime to skyrocket now as well, but as of yesterday still only this lone hour is in use. Were they simply not able to add more until now because everybody is still on vacation?" -- VOA Azerbaijani has three shortwave frequencies, 9625, 9805, and 12025 kHz, at 1830-1900 UT. BANGLADESH - 4750 kHz is off at present. As I wondered whether Bangladesh 4750 kHz inaudible from Kolkata, India was a propagation hiccup, I got a prompt reply from the station which puts the controversy to rest:

"Senior Engineer, RRC, BB, Dhaka Dear Dr Supratik Sanatani, At present 4750 kHz is in trouble. There is no other SW transmission for HS. Please try to reach 693 kHz MW."

7250 is clear channel from 1330 when Vatican Radio Italian signs off, Bangladesh Betar Nepali service audible December 30 to 1345 off, local music then closing announcement, fair strength, modulation low but you could follow the programme (Mike Barraclough, Jan World DX Club Contact via DXLD)

Odd channel noted today Jan 2nd: 7249.993, tentative Bangladesh at 1720 UT (wb)

BENIN - 5025 ORTB, Parakou, 1842-..., 30 Dec, Vernacular (tent), talks; 45444 but this doesn't apply to audio which was hardly audible; it was a bit better at 2015 when in Vernacular and ditto art 2200 when airing French prgr. Thanks to this, even using the CeAfr Beverage, Cuba's R. Rebelde is perceived on the background (it's mighty strong via the CAM Beverage).

BHUTAN - 6035 at 0025- UT, Bhutan Broadcasting Service Jan 1. Very good reception of Buddhist chanting for several minutes and then much lower modulation talk. I was surprised to hear them as well as I did, although during the summer and early fall, they were very well heard in our local mornings.

6035 at 0001- UT, Bhutan Broadcasting Service Jan 2. At tune in at 2350 UT, there is a test continuous test tone. When checked at 0000 UT there's talk by a male with an interesting horn in the background that must be Bhutan. The chanting that's usually reported as starting at 0025 UT in fact came on at 000230! Unmistakeable! As my location approaches darkness (sunset is in another 36 minutes), the signal has improved to quite good. Most interesting for sure! Conditions not as good as last night, when Bhutan was coming in at superb levels. Much weaker tonight, but still perfectly readable. (Walt Salmaniw-BC-CAN, DXplorer Jan 2)

6035, BBS, 1534-1625, Dec 31, extended New Year's Day programming (usually 1500*), in English and vernacular, man and woman DJs (these are the regular announcers I have often heard on their weekly live call-in shows) with many on-air calls with requests for dedications (asked for "All Summer Long", "More Than I Can Say", etc.), asks caller: "Where are you?", he said "Thimphu", "Thank you very much for calling, Happy New Year", playing pop and rap songs in English, best audio level I have ever heard from them. QRM from strong CNR-1 on 6030 and 6035 was totally covered at 1625 by strong sign-on of NHK.

Hi Glenn, Bhutan Broadcasting Service e-QSL received today from Sherub Tharchen (sherubt@bbs.com.bt) for detailed report (on 6035 kHz 0100-0145 UT on 28 December). This ends a long saga for me having heard them in English on 60mb in the early 90s. I can still remember the program details! I sent a report at the time and got a reply from a Thimphu travel agent asking me to put an ad in a local South African newspaper for him. In return he would get the station to QSL. I did this and sent him a copy but no reply. Easily heard here at this time with 100 kW. Even so, nice to have this one after all these years. 5035.1 R. Educacao Rural, Coari AM, was a nice surprise, 2226-2239, 30 Dec, prgr "Agricultura Familiar", a govern. sponsored feature helping small, family farming units, advertisements, sermon; 43443, QRM de R.

Aparecida 5035. For Braz. stns in AC & AM area, the CeAm Beverage partly chokes signals emanating from eastern states.

5970 R. Itatiaia, Belo Horizonte MG, 2242-2252, 27 Dec, songs; 23421, adj. QRM.

6090 R. Bandeirantes, Sao Paulo SP, 0010-0019, 27 Dec, talks abt. f/ball; 42442, QRM de AIA, and much stronger than // 11925.2.

6150 R. Record, Sao Paulo SP, 0004-0007*, 27 Dec, end of newscast, talks, abruptly off on this fq & on // 9505; 44433, adj. QRM.

FRANCE - *RFI RUSSIAN will continue on SHORTWAVE, at least through 2011.*

Sergei S. in Moscow translates this announcement from the Radio France International Russian Service: "I'd like to tell you that RFI's Russian service had its own Christmas miracle. As reported by AFP, the petition to save our SW and MW radio service reached President Sarkozy, Prime Minister Fillon, Minister of Culture Albanel and all deputies of the National Council.

After that our leadership immediately announced that their decision to shut down the Russian radio service was actually under 'consideration' and that in any case our SW and MW broadcasts will continue until the end of 2011. Now we'd like to ask all our listeners to be vigilant. If you don't hear us on our usual wavelengths at usual time, please inform us immediately. Also, our leadership invited us to return to our old format of two one-hour programs daily. Right now we have two 30-min. and one 60-min. broadcast.

If only you knew how much we fought in the past that we might continue with two one-hour programs! Truly, a new broom sweeps very clean in order to prove that the old one didn't do the work well" RFI Russian, 24 December 2008. Posted: 01 Jan 2009 (<kimandrewelliott.com> via dxld Jan 2)

NEW ZEALAND - New Zealand's ZLXA 3935 Goes Silent We've just heard that New Zealand shortwave station, ZLXA of the Radio Reading Service, is about to permanently sign off the air.

In fact, it has already been silent since December 1 2008 and, as the following message from Kelvin Brayshaw [QSL Manager] says, the chances of it returning, except for a last special broadcast for DXers, are very unlikely.

From: Kelvin Brayshaw

I'm sorry to have to tell you that, in all probability, the shortwave service of the Radio Reading Service will soon be discontinued. ZLXA, 3935kHz, has been in abeyance since 1st December 2008 pending the result of a listener survey and the consideration of cost-effectiveness.

The final outcome is expected to be advised following deliberations by management at the first board meeting of the year - probably in February.

I feel there will be members of SWL groups who might appreciate an opportunity to log this transmitter one last time during the northern winter, and I'm sure that if you were to make a special request on behalf of shortwave listeners, RRS management would, in a continuing spirit of goodwill, consider marking an event of such significance to the worldwide DX community by resuming transmission for a brief period.

In the meantime Radio Reading Service programmes are streaming on the Internet.

Beromünster takes its leave of the airwaves by Robert Brookes

The medium wave transmitter at Beromünster in central Switzerland fell silent forever on Sunday night, 77 years and seven months after it first came into service.

For many Swiss, there will be more than a touch of sadness, as Beromünster was a household name they grew up with; it is without doubt an integral part of the country's radio history.

Look on the dial of any decent radio from the past. Beromünster features on the far right along with other great names, for example Lyons, Stuttgart, Vienna, Berlin, Monte Ceneri (southern Switzerland), AFN and Budapest.

With technology advancing to VHF and now DAB, the transmitter's days were numbered and the decision was made a few years ago to pull the plug on what finally was broadcasting a Swiss country music programme on 531 kHz.

Two men who "grew up" with the transmitter, technicians Hermann Weber and Hans Moser, have been looking after it in its final years. They have each clocked up 40 years of service.

"At present there are only two of us here and we do everything from being caretakers to repairing the transmitter, and we're responsible for the programme being broadcast until midnight on December 28," Weber told swissinfo.

He said he would look back on his career at Beromünster with "a little bit of nostalgia, but then a new stage in life will begin – retirement – that's also nice".

Beromünster is something of a misnomer because it is not actually located in the commune of the same name but in neighbouring Gunzwil.

It's worth remembering that at the beginning, the radio transmitter was considered great competition for the daily newspapers and that after a struggle, the transmitter broadcast only two new bulletins a day.

Then came the Second World War. There were weekly commentaries on the situation from radio legend Jean-Rodolphe von Salis, and everyone was glued not to the box but to the radio.

Beromünster was respected, not just in Switzerland, as the only independent German-language broadcaster.

After the war, Beromünster was as popular as ever. The programmes were not just about national events and music, but also entertainment.

"At that time we only had a radio at home with medium wave, so we always had Beromünster on," Weber recalls.

"At 12.30pm the news came on and we all had to keep quiet. We didn't have a television then, so in the evening we listened to the stories of [Swiss author] Jeremias Gotthelf and the whole family sat in front of the radio."

Later on, Weber recalls that he had reached the "awkward adolescent age", switched off from Beromünster and tuned into Luxembourg, where there was different music.

"When our parents came into the room, they used to say: 'This music is not for you!'"

Significant moments for Beromünster fans were also commentaries from Heiner Gautschi in New York and Theodor Haller in London. And there were concerts from radio orchestras in Switzerland that no longer exist.

After 40 years working at the installation, now run by Swisscom Broadcast, Weber is still very much a fan of what the transmitter broadcasts.

"When I listen to the radio, it's on the Musikwelle (mostly Swiss traditional music played by German-language Swiss radio from the transmitter). On the one hand it's to hear whether the transmitter is working (laughs), on the other I like the programme. It's varied and plays music I like."

The transmitter will die on December 28 but there are proposals to keep the installation intact as a museum. Weber is certainly not convinced about that idea.

"After the closure, I'd prefer that all the signs of the transmitter disappear. When a transmitter doesn't broadcast, it's not a transmitter anymore and there's not enough here for an interesting museum."

Weber and his colleague Moser are not giving too much away about what they will be doing when midnight strikes on Sunday.

But you may just find them in the control room drinking a glass to an old friend that has been with them for the best part of their working lives.
