





CENTRAL AFRICAN REP. - Engineers Install Additional Shortwave Stations in Central African Republic
(Source: HCJB Global, written by Jean Muehlfelt, May 2010)

Imagine living in a country where you can't access the Internet, watch television, read newspapers or even receive mail. Except in Bangui, the capital city of the Central African Republic (C.A.R.), that's what life is like for most of the country's 4.5 million residents. Their lifeline to the rest of the world? Radio. People in C.A.R., a country about the size of Texas, depend on radio broadcasts to keep informed. Almost every village has a radio, and some have more than one. The sets are affordable, costing as little as US\$6, usually coming from countries such as Nigeria and Niger. The radios typically have FM, shortwave and medium-wave bands.

Until 2005 there were only six private FM stations and one governmental shortwave station in this country where villagers have a life expectancy of just 44 years. It was then that Integrated Community Development International (ICDI), a partner of HCJB Global, was granted permission to open the country's first privately owned shortwave radio station, Radio ICDI.

In early 2006 the ministry acquired an eight-acre tract of land on the plateau above the town of Boali. A road to the transmitter site was built, and electricity was installed. Equipment was transported in large shipping containers, and eventually one of the 20-foot-long metal containers was converted into a studio and transmitter building. A year later a team from HCJB Global Technology Center in Elkhart, Ind., spent three weeks at the broadcast site, installed the first shortwave radio station. They also put in two satellite downlinks that provided access to the Internet and made it possible to receive French-language Christian programming from Trans World Radio, another HCJB Global

partner.

Last month HCJB Global engineers returned to C.A.R. to put in two additional regional shortwave radio stations in Boali, similar to the station installed in 2007. One of the new stations will help extend the broadcast hours of the existing ICDI station into the nighttime. Each station only works well during a portion of each day because of how shortwave signals travel through the atmosphere. The new ICDI radio stations will provide more programming opportunities for broadcasting the gospel across C.A.R. in Sango (the country's trade language), French and various tribal dialects. Additional hours will also increase the opportunity to air more community development programs on AIDS prevention, orphan care, well-water repair programs and many other relevant humanitarian topics.

Curt Bender, manager of broadcast services at HCJB Global in Elkhart, said, "I want to give the Lord recognition for sustaining our team through two difficult installations in the past three years and to praise Him for the success." According to my sources Radio ICDI night-time frequency will be 3390. Web-blog of Dan Anderson at <<http://danhcjb.org>> tells us that another transmitter will be installed by HCJB engineers as a gift for Radio Centrafrique at Bangui-Bimbo site. Frequency not yet announced but probably 5035. The website also has photos of antenna installation at both sites. these two transmitters are low power, rated only as 1 kW. May have been in Portuguese already on 21690 which has been running for hours, and previously heard in languages other than scheduled French-only, due to satellite mixup? There is no Brazilian at all on the RFI SW sked, just Portuguese to Africa at 1700-1800 daily to CAf, Waf via 15530 Issoudun per the WRTH A-10 update.

21690 is not on that RFI schedule at all now, but I heard it poorly in a quick check after 2100 June 4. It is, however, on the HFCC A-10 schedule for 17-22, 500 kW, 75 degrees from GUF, only in French.

This of course raises questions about the uptodateness of the full RFI sked in WRTH update. RFI is notorious for failing to display its accurate current schedule on its own website, should anyone be tempted to believe that (e.g. also not specifying morning English is M-F only).

17630, still did not tune in early enough to determine exactly what is happening with the unscheduled Portuguese broadcast of RFI via GUIANA FRENCH: June 5 at 2058 music is underway, 2059 closing announcement in Brazilian, "até a próxima", but then instead of going right into scheduled Spanish at 2100 we had more than a minute of dead air, or rather hummy air until Spanish news was joined in progress at 2101:05. Then checked unscheduled 21690 and it was JBA but in French.

Having missed carrier-on the last two days for the 2100-2130 RFI Spanish on 17630 via GUIANA FRENCH, I tuned in very early June 6 before 2050, but this time it did not cut on until *2058:50, musical modulation from 2059, sounded like hiliife but could not determine lyrix language; possibly Portuguese as before, but no announcement. 2100 4-pip timesignal 6 seconds late, opening RFI Spanish at 11 de la noche en París, noticias, good signal but with some hum (gh, WOR 1516, DXLD)

21540, R Kuwait in Arabic with more than fair signal of S=9+15dB at 1200 UT June 6. Co-channel REE Noblejas in Spanish on weekends was very weak UNDERNEATH, and latter hardly readable (wb)

LAOS [non] - 11785, Hmong World Christian Radio via WHRI, June 5 at 1320 with lo-fi preaching, later presumed hymn in traditional style with shades of Beatle riffs, atop but heavy CCI from ChiCom jamming and VOA Chinese via Tinang, Philippines, 250 kW at 332 degrees. WHRI is 100 kW due NW from Furman, intended primarily for all the Hmong in Hminnesota.

Altho conditions from E Asia vary a lot, on a good morning those signals are in heavy competition with WHRI even in CNAm. I wonder why HWCR, Saturdays 1300-1330, puts up good money for this terrible frequency which could easily be changed to a clear one. It used to be 500 kW, which helped, but too expensive. Stayed on past 1330 with a preacher in English. BTW, Aoki still hasn't caught up with the A-10 scheduling for HWCR, still showing B-09's timing of 1500-1530 (gh, DXLD)

2348-2350 UT, TX was already on air for opening check, when logged at 2348 UT, much fluttery signal of S=9+15dB. Next check at 2352-2357 UT, TX was OFF air. TX came on air after all at 23.57:20 UT. 23.59:00 UT start of Kremlin chimes interval signal.

June 2nd at 0000 UT ID "This is Moscow, you are tuned to the World Service of Voice of Russia". Female newsreader, Israel's air strike against Gaza strip in Palestine, 19 peoples killed on Israel marine action on international water. 600 human rights activists brought food and good aid to Palestins at Gaza in Palestine. But were forced by Israeli marines on international water area... etc.

I just found out that VoR is back on Sosnovy transmitter starting from June 1! Acc. to DXing.ru, it's in Russian 1300-1500 and 1700-1900 UT on 1170 for "Europe and Belarus." Another SW change (in addition to VoR English using 7440 0000-0200 for its NA coverage) is that VoR German can be heard from 0900-1000 on 11655 kHz.

VoR used to run an AM/MW relay in Vilnius for its Russian service. But that was stopped a few months ago due to financial difficulties. More notably, an AM relay in Belarus was also discontinued. (Many DX publications still list Belarusian tx on 1170 as being used by VoR).

7440 VOR has a surprise new frequency for English to North America at 00-02: 7440, first noted by Harry Brooks in England on UT June 1. So I was standing by for it before 0000 UT June 2: carrier on between 2357 and 2358; open carrier until 2359 VOR IS, 0000 opening WS of VOR, no frequencies ever announced, of course; 7440 is only a fair signal, little better than 9890 which is still on, but 7440 has no ACI unlike 9890 from the Cuban/American radio war on 9885. 9735 also came on at 0000 in VOR Spanish via Guiana French.

The question is, what is the site for 7440 VOR? Until a couple months ago this was the super-power frequency of R Ukraine International, including English to North America at 0000-0100, nominally 600 of the rated 1000 kW via Lviv site. SW from RUI was suspended but they keep claiming that is temporary and they will resume. But with Russia on their frequency??? Are we in for a big collision when RUI come back?

Or has VOR axually reached a deal with the new pro-Russian Uke government to use the Lviv transmitter, just like the good old Soviet days? As Wolfgang Bueschel also speculates, this could be a temporary measure to keep the transmitter site in business if RUI itself can not afford to use it.

Russia connection friendly now. Could be high power transmission to North America 7440 LV 600 kW 303 deg.

Old friends on the southwards Balcan in Bulgaria and Albania are now independent. And to lease powerful TCI antenna at Sitkunai-Lithuania, may avoided by injured Russian ego.

Were it really financial difficulties that brought an end to the VOR relays via Vilnius and Sosnovy? Or was it just a strategic decision, a result of considerations if and where money should still be used for AM transmitters?

And shortwave to the western hemisphere is apparently just no priority anymore. VOR would have no need to search for new facilities, the German partners (if not friends) can not only provide another option for transatlantic shots but also arrange relays via Montsinery over there.

Now this 7440 relay: I suspect it must have been offered to VOR proactively. But by whom? Was it the transmitter operator RRT? Or is it NRKU itself who now leases this slot to VOR, probably this way avoiding a permanent loss of its access to the RRT shortwave facilities, especially for the current conditions?

Adventist World Radio - AWR DX Program "Wavescan" Annual DX Contest - 2010 "Station Profiles"

It's that time of the year again! Yes, we're talking about our big annual DX contest here in "Wavescan". The title for our big 2010 DX contest is "Station Profiles", and here are the details for all five parts in this year's contest:-

A. Five Station Profiles:

Make a list of five different radio stations for which you would like to have a "Station Profile" presented on air in a coming edition of "Wavescan". You may suggest five different radio stations, or the radio stations in five different cities, or in five different countries, or any combinations of these designations. These radio stations may still be on the air, or they may now be silent. You may choose only shortwave broadcasting stations, or shortwave communication stations that have been used also for broadcasting.

B. Five Paragraphs:

You are invited to write just one short paragraph about each of the five stations you have chosen in the above list, and state why you have chosen that particular station.

C. Five Photocopies:

You are invited to search your QSL collection, and where possible, provide a photocopy of a QSL from each of the five radio stations in your above list. These photocopies should be in color if possible, but black & white is also acceptable. If you do not have a QSL from any of the stations you select, then you should indicate the reason why you do not have a QSL; such as for example, the station is now silent, or you are unable to hear the station in your part of the world, or they do not verify reception reports, etc.

D. Three Reception Reports:

You are invited to send in at least three reception reports on any transmission from Adventist World Radio on any station, shortwave, mediumwave and FM.

E. Three Radio Cards:

Where possible, you are invited to include three radio cards for the Indianapolis Heritage Collection with your contest entry. These cards may be old or new, and they may be QSL cards, reception report cards, or picture cards of radio stations, etc. (Not valid for this contest are amateur cards nor CB cards.)

Other Contest Details:

Well, there you have it, the details for our "Wavescan 2010 Station Profiles DX Contest". This contest will run through the month of July 2010, and all contest entries should be postmarked at your local post office anywhere in the world on any date up to the end of the month of July, and they should be received at the AWR post office address in Indianapolis no later than the end of the month of August 2010.

Return postage in the form of currency notes in an international currency, or mint postage stamps, or IRC coupons would be welcome. Where possible, a self addressed return envelope, business size or half quarto size, would also be welcome.

The awards for this year's contest will be similar to all previous contests. There will be a special award for the world winner, one of the Jerry Berg radio history books; and World Radio TV Handbook 2011 for each continental winner. In addition, there will be other special awards as well as AWR souvenirs and radio curios for many participants. There will be special awards for listeners in Africa responding to this year's contest.

You can remember that all reception reports will be verified with a specially endorsed AWR QSL card. Please remember that it will take a period of many months to process all of the reception reports, but each will in due course be verified. In addition, and over a period of time, it is our intent to present in our Wavescan DX program, many, and perhaps all, of the "Station Profiles" as submitted in this year's DX contest.

When we present each of these specific "Station Profiles" in our "Wavescan" program, we will also call on-air the listener who made the suggestion. When the listener hears his name in the program, he can send in a reception report and receive a specially endorsed QSL card.
