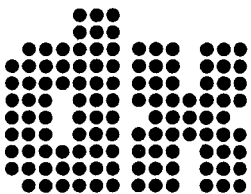

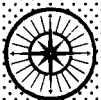

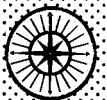

Zudem erscheint die modifizierte Datenbank in einem neuen Layout.

Die EMF-Datenbank gibt Nutzern Auskunft über den Standort der nächstgelegenen ortsfesten Funkanlage und zu den Sicherheitsabständen, die von der Bundesnetzagentur festgelegt wurden. Des Weiteren erhält der Bürger Antworten auf Fragen zu Feldstärkemessungen und Informationen zur Höhe der örtlichen Immissionen. Für diese bürgerfreundliche frei zugängliche Online-Recherche stehen Daten zu 11.847 Feldstärkemessungen, 82.260 Senderstandorten und 552.777 bewerteten Sendeantennen zur Verfügung.

Don't know about July 8, but July 9 at 1240, 7355 is weakly audible with typical KNLS programming, pop music probably gospel rock; 1243 YL in English mentions Norway, then OM interviewing YL but too poor to copy in QRN, QSB. Anyhow, KNLS' only surviving English broadcast at 12-13 is back, tho admittedly reruns thru July.

**RADIO SYMBAN RETURNS TO SW IN ITS THIRD REINCARNATION**

I can confirm that Radio Symban is now back on air 2368.5 kHz from its third SW transmitter site in Sydney's SW (Leppington). Noting the station on air today June 26, 2010 at 0125 UT. I'm unsure of the exact date this station came to air, but it is within the last 6 or 7 days. Also the SW antenna was removed from the former Marrickville SW site between May 10th & June 15th, 2010. Station first heard at my location on (local date) 26 June. Was possibly still testing at that time, with frequent brief breaks in transmission (David Sharp, NSW Australia, June 28, dxldyg via WOR 1519, DXLD)

It is received for the first time in Japan at 1535 UT on 24 Jun.

RA on new 9500 for English and Chinese, ex-9475. I wonder if they finally had enough of the 4-kHz het from WTWW 9479? (Tho missing for hours on July 8, 9479 was back on at 2217 check.) WTWW said it had surprisingly good reports from E Asia during its test phase.

July 9 at 1251 Late Nite Live discussion of technology on 9500, weaker than // 9560, 9580, 9590, but nothing detectable on 9475 aside WTWW. At 1304, 9500 had switched to Chinese, which was what used to happen on 9475, vacant. 1402, 9500 RA Chinese still audible in the clear. Per Aoki, 9500 was already in use by RA Shepparton but only at 19-22.

Tho RA was on 9500 instead of 9475 as I reported July 9, on July 10 it was back on 9475: at 1259, telltale het of 4 kHz against superstrong WTWW 9479, nothing on 9500, and could make out Chinese at 1300 on 9475. 1404 still nothing on 9500, something on 9475. So was 9500 a mistake or a test?

Another check to see what RA is doing with 9500 and 9475, July 11: at 1241, nothing on 9500, and too much WTWW 9479 splash to detect RA on 9475, but presumably still back there (gh, WOR 1521, DXLD)

15240, 0519-, Radio Australia, Jul 12. Excellent reception with 100 kW beamed 30 degrees in English with Australian politics. Parallel 15160, also from Shepparton, but at 65 degree beam with 100 kW, only fair level. 13690 at excellent level from Shepparton at 353 deg beam and 100 kW. Another very strong channel is 13630 again from Shepparton with 100 kW beamed 50 degrees. Finally, there's 17750 at fair level from Shepparton at 100 kW, 329 deg beam (this one at 0535). A lot of frequencies! Australia obviously takes SW seriously (Walter Salmaniw, Masset, B.C., dxldyg via DXLD)

A woman with occasional background music was heard from 0829.5 to 0842. At 0842 a man in English introduced a continuation of the sportscast, which started at 0842.5 and was in English. The sportscast continued past 0900 at the same S3 level. The programming was very similar to other "official" PNG stations, especially the woman announcer. The signal started at S- 2 but improved to S-3 by 0820 or so with only light QRN. Some strong adjacent-channel splatter QRM but not really bothersome. No trace of the Chinese station here. Nothing usable heard on the 3915 channel. In searching Google for info on Radio Fly, I found the following:

"Radio Fly is a community radio station which is funded and operated by Ok Tedi Mining Limited. It provides a vital community information service to isolated areas of the North Fly region, parts of West Sepik, the rest of Western Province and some areas along the border of West Papua. It broadcasts in English and Tok Pisin. The isolated location of Western Province means that access to mainstream media is very limited, but Radio Fly fills that void.

The station is vital for the Community Mine Continuation process, informing villages of visits from community relations officers, and keeping them apprised of the environmental conditions and mine activity. A large chunk of the programming is focused on health and education messages as well as sustainable development, which is a topic very close to the listeners' hearts.

As well as playing a wide range of music and entertainment, Radio Fly serves as a medium for dissemination of relevant information. The Tok Save (announcement) service is widely used by people all over the province, to announce social and business gatherings such as government visits, sports meets, women's training sessions, weddings, funerals, and workshops.

Legal, health, farming and business-oriented programs are widely heard, and children's and religious shows are very popular with regular listeners. Volunteers with a particular interest often come into the studio to present their own programs, and there is a three- times-daily news bulletin, which covers local, national and international stories. The Fly Weekly Top 10 Hit Parade is a compilation of the most popular requests and dedications of the week, as made by listeners."

5960 R. Fly. E-mail QSL from Jobby Paiva received on 6/30 for 6/26 reception. Report included a 7 minute recording referred to in the e-mail and a screen shot of the Perseus spectrum during reception at the same time period on 6/30. I won't be holding my breath on the QSL card, Hi! These days, an e-mail QSL is pretty much all you can count on. E-mail received read as follows (answers the location question but not the station's power for which I will query Jobby):

Dear Bruce, Greetings from Tabubil in the Star Mountains of the Western Province of Papua New Guinea.

Thank you for your email which I received yesterday. I must apologise as I didn't get around to replying most of my emails yesterday but am going through them today.

I confirm that you were listening to Radio Fly. We are an FM radio station but only expanded into shortwave about a month ago. 5960 kHz & 3915 kHz.

What you were listening to was the service announcements by Beri Pius. She is a journalist who does mainly news but tries a bit of broadcasting or Disc Jockeying as well. She usually does the Friday & Saturday nights as we are also short staffed.

Thanks for your detailed report which I will forward to our technical personnel. Unfortunately we haven't designed a QSL card yet. Once we do, we will send you one. Until then, I thank you for your report.

**SAUDI ARABIA** - Continental Electronics will supply a quantity of 4 each 250 kW HF DRM-ready transmitters and associated equipment to the Saudi Arabia Ministry of Information (MOI) through First Gulf Company of Riyadh. First Gulf will construct an entirely new HF station where the transmitters, antennas, and other equipment will be installed at the existing Al Khumra site outside Jeddah. The Al Khumra station was constructed by Continental Electronics and its civil contractor between 1978 and 1980, and the site presently accommodates multiple 2-megawatt and 1-megawatt Medium Wave transmitters.

The new high-power HF DRM-ready transmitters will enhance the Saudi MOI's digital broadcast capabilities and can reach targeted audiences at long distance ranges with a clear, high quality signal. The DRM-ready transmitters are similar to those recently supplied to Broadcast Australia and to Radio-TV Malaysia, employing Transradio's latest DRM excitors with its unique pre-correction features.

The transmitters will be delivered in the latter part of 2010 and the station is planned to be fully operational by mid-2011.

Poor to fair signal but a lot of noise on channel made overall reception very poor most of the time. Reception seemed to improve around 0330 during continuous music run. At 0356 man announcer mentioned BBC news at 0400. 3+1 time pips at 04000 followed by woman announcer with BBC news. Although reception was improving, I could still only make out about 25% of what was being said during news.
- 3290 GUYANA, Voice of Guyana, 0340-0406 Jun 12, music program hosted by a man announcer with English talk. ID followed by BBC news at 0400. Weak signal and watery audio.

- 4789.9 PERU, Radio Vision, 0450-0532 May 29, man announcer preaching in Spanish before a "live" audience. At 0523 studio announcer with ID and other announcements before returning to another preacher at 0525. Fair with some CODAR QRM.
- 4976 UGANDA, UBC Uganda (presumed), 0351-0421 Jun 13, continuous music programming to 0400 when a man announcer read the news in English. Return to music programming at 0415. Poor with high noise level.
- 5954.2 COSTA RICA, ELCOR Transmitter, 2310-2352 May 17, non-stop pop music vocals. Carrier cut at 2322 but returned at 2329. Appeared to be recording of "live" concert with applause between selections and on-stage announcements in Spanish. Fair signal.
- 6170 NEW ZEALAND, Radio New Zealand International, 1054-1058\* Jun 3, two men discussing airport improvement issues in English when suddenly cut off by a man with ID and closedown announcement: "This is the Pacific Service of Radio New Zealand International (mentioned moving to 9,655 kHz) ... This is New Zealand." Fair to good reception.
- 7125 GUINEA, Radio Guinee, 2256-2259\* May 18, two men with discussion in French language with carrier cut mid-sentence. Poor.
- 7215 SOUTH AFRICA, Trans World Radio via Meyerton, \*0328-0335 Jun 12, IS followed by opening of listed Amharic program with music and religious talk. Poor.
- 7345 TUNISIA, Radio Tunisienne, 2302-2307\* May 27, man announcer with news in Arabic. At 2307 end of news, man with ID, carrier cut. Fair to good.
- 9635 LITHUANIA, Radio Free Europe / Radio Liberty via Sitkunai, 0337-0401\* May 26, news features in listed Tatar/Bashkir. English ID by man announcer at 0400: "This is Radio Free Europe, Radio Liberty, Praha." Fair.
- 9655 NEW ZEALAND, Radio New Zealand International, \*1059-1110 Jun 3, IS with time pips at 1100 followed by opening ID and news by a man announcer. ID at end of the news at 1108 followed by a woman announcer with regional news features. Poor to fair with somewhat watery audio.
- 9710 AUSTRALIA, Radio Australia - Shepparton, 0706-0745 May 29, man announcer in English with live sports coverage. Poor to fair.
- 9740 CLANDESTINE, Miraya FM via Rimavská Sobota, 0330-0356 May 22, Arabic talks by various male announcers including interviews, remote reports and voice over's. Periodic IDs with a formal ID at 0342 followed by more news features. Fair.
- 9875 CLANDESTINE (Zimbabwe), Radio Voice of the People - Madagascar, 0401-0423 Jun 10, woman announcer in local language with news featuring music segments between each item. Report about the World Cup. From 0407 a combination of music programming alternating with news features with some English and periodic IDs. Poor to fair.
- 9890 RUSSIA, Voice of Russia - Krasnodar, 0006-0032 Jun 4, man with news in English followed by main points. ID followed by Outlook program featuring oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico as first report. Good signal.
- 11530 USA, Family Radio - Okeechobee, \*0357-0412 May 22, looking for Denge Mezopotamya but heard familiar Family Radio IS followed by opening in Portuguese language. Poor signal.
- 11960 JORDAN, Radio Jordan, 0352-0420 Jun 10, woman with Arabic vocals; man announcer with ID and Arabic talk at 0400 followed by music fanfare and news. At one point I could hear the man turning the pages of his script! Fair.
- 15250 CUBA, Radio Nacional de Venezuela, 2333-2357\* Jun 3, apparent English service with a woman announcer presenting various news-related topics which were followed by long Spanish talks. Nice canned ID at 2356 followed by sign off announcements by a man announcer in Spanish. Fair.

## RFA ISSUES SECOND QSL CARD IN MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS SERIES

Radio Free Asia (RFA) announces the release of the second card in the QSL series celebrating musical instruments of Asia. This card shows a traditional Burmese harp, also known as the saung or the saung gauk. It is an arched harp that usually has 13 to 16 strings that are traditionally made from silk though nylon strings are now more prevalent. The harp is played while sitting on the floor and holding it in one's lap; the strings are plucked with the right hand while the musician uses their left hand to dampen the strings which improve note clarity and help produce staccato notes. This card will be used to confirm all valid reception reports from **July 1 – August 31, 2010.**
